Washington, July 24 (P)-French Ambassador Herve Alphand said today Premier Charles de Gaulle "is not in favor" of a summit conference within the United Nations Security Council in New York at this time. But, he later issued a statement leaving completely i doubt whether De Gaulle finally would refuse to attend.
