635 Job Seekers Placed by Office

A total of 635 persons were placed in either permanent or temporary jobs during July by the local office of the State Employment Service.

Miss Hazel Anderson, manager, said 136 of this number secured non-agricultural work in the Hartford, Thompsonville and Willimantic areas.

In the agricultural classification, 490 were signed up, with most of them going to temporary jobs in the tobacco fields, while the vast majority are expected to attend to dairy work.

Last month 435 persons applied for jobs, bringing the total number seeking employment up to 2,604. Frederick Kania, employed at the local office, gave 47 counseling interviews and there were 4 aptitude tests and 39 proficiency tests given.

Last year during the same period, 446 applied for jobs and there were 1,149 in the active file seeking employment. The number placed in jobs that month were 407-117 in non-agricultural jobs, 2 in surrounding areas, and 282 in agricultural jobs.
