2 Balloonists Hurt In Space Test Hop

Abland, Wis., Aug. 14 (AP)—Theory of plastic balloons crashed a training balloon gondola last night in the space test hop. The flight was made by a man who was preparing for a solo flight to test a new reaction to a stratosphere 140-foot balloon.

Capt. Grover Schick, 32, and Otto C. Wiseman, 40, suffered extensive injuries when their gondola plunged 100-150 feet to the Earth after they cut loose from the balloon as it headed out over Lake Superior. They apparently released rather than blown over the water in darkness. They crashed into a pasture a half mile inland when the parachute on the basket failed to open.

Their fall was witnessed by a police officer, a waiting ambulance crew and two men in a plane next aloft to follow the balloon.

Mrs. G. E. Terwilliger, on whose farm the crash occurred, said "There was a terrific thud when the gondola came down 100 yards from our house."

She said the balloon had been flying low, dragging a line that came close enough to graze the top of a tree and while it was out of sight, it heard a loud report. When she reached the scene, the open parachute was spread on the ground and Schick and Wiseman were being placed in an ambulance.

Shock, a space biology specialist, was cut under the chin from one side of the face. He also suffered back and possible internal injuries. He was in critical condition but showing improvement, according to Capt. George Ruff, an Air Force physician treating him at St. Joseph's hospital here.

The physician said Schick could not be moved to determine the full extent of his injuries. Assigned to Holman Air Force Base, N.M., Schick was raised in Galesburg, Ill.

Wiseman is president of Winnetka Research, Inc., a manufacturer of plastic balloons for experimental purposes. He is in good condition, but suffered two broken ribs, a fractured right arm and back injuries. He will be hospitalized for several weeks.

BOLD HIDING PAYS OFF TRIAL TO FIVE YEAR

Nobody claims that Arch Underhill hid his money. He hoped that his king of diamonds would be used, but it didn't help South a bit. Instead, South had to play for the king of hearts. He could afford to lose only one of them.

After some thought, he got the idea of trumping one of his clubs in the dummy. A strange idea, since dummy had more clubs than he had. But it worked.

South won the first trump with the queen, led a heart to dummy's king and ducked a club to the opponents. Back came a trump, king in with declarer's own plan. If the defenders hadn't led a second trump, South would have made his bid.

Declarer next cashed the ace and queen of hearts, discarding two clubs from the dummy. This left dummy with only one club. South could then lead the ace of clubs and ruff a club with dummy's last trump.

Everything got by without a ruff by the enemy, and South could then get to his back by ruffing a diamond in order to draw the last club from the cards.

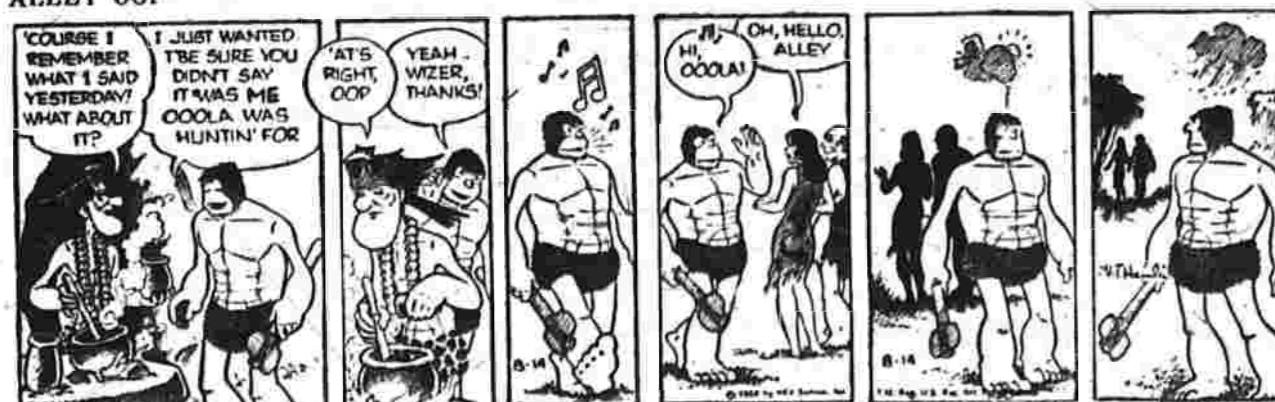

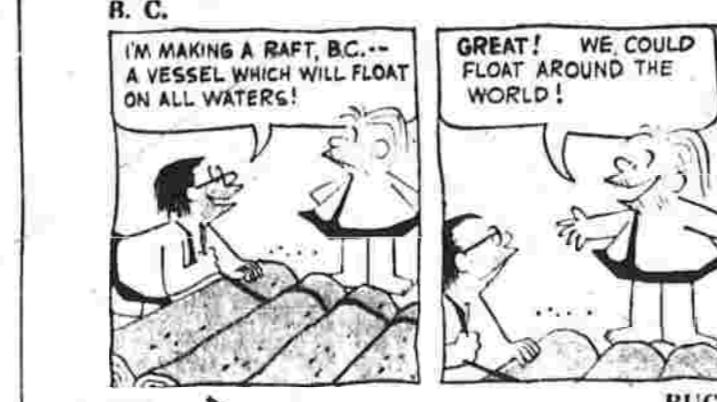

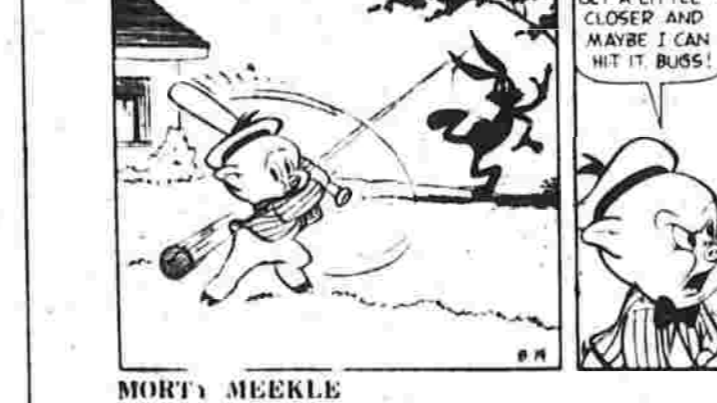
