Washington, Aug. 21 (AP)—President Eisenhower has signed legislation giving the reciprocal trade program four more years of life. It is the longest extension ever granted by Congress.

The Administration had requested a five-year extension, but Eisenhower believed that it was better to have a shorter extension which would give Congress a chance to act on the program before the end of the session.

Eisenhower praised Congress for giving the program four more years of life. He said that the program has been successful in increasing trade and creating jobs.

In addition, he said the free trade agreement with the European Economic Community will be in effect for four more years. He said that the agreement will help to increase trade and create jobs.

The four-year extension is expected to give the program sufficient time to give the government sufficient power to deal with future trade problems arising from the new European common market.

The tariff-cutting authority will be cumulative over the four years. Any unused authority can be held over for use later in the year. Congress added provisions designed to protect industries from injury from imports.

Another provision will allow Congress by a two-thirds vote of both Houses to suspend the tariff-cutting authority for any one or more commodities, even though the President has already signed the law.

The President is also directed to consider the impact of imports on the Nation's economy, especially any substantial unemployment which may result.

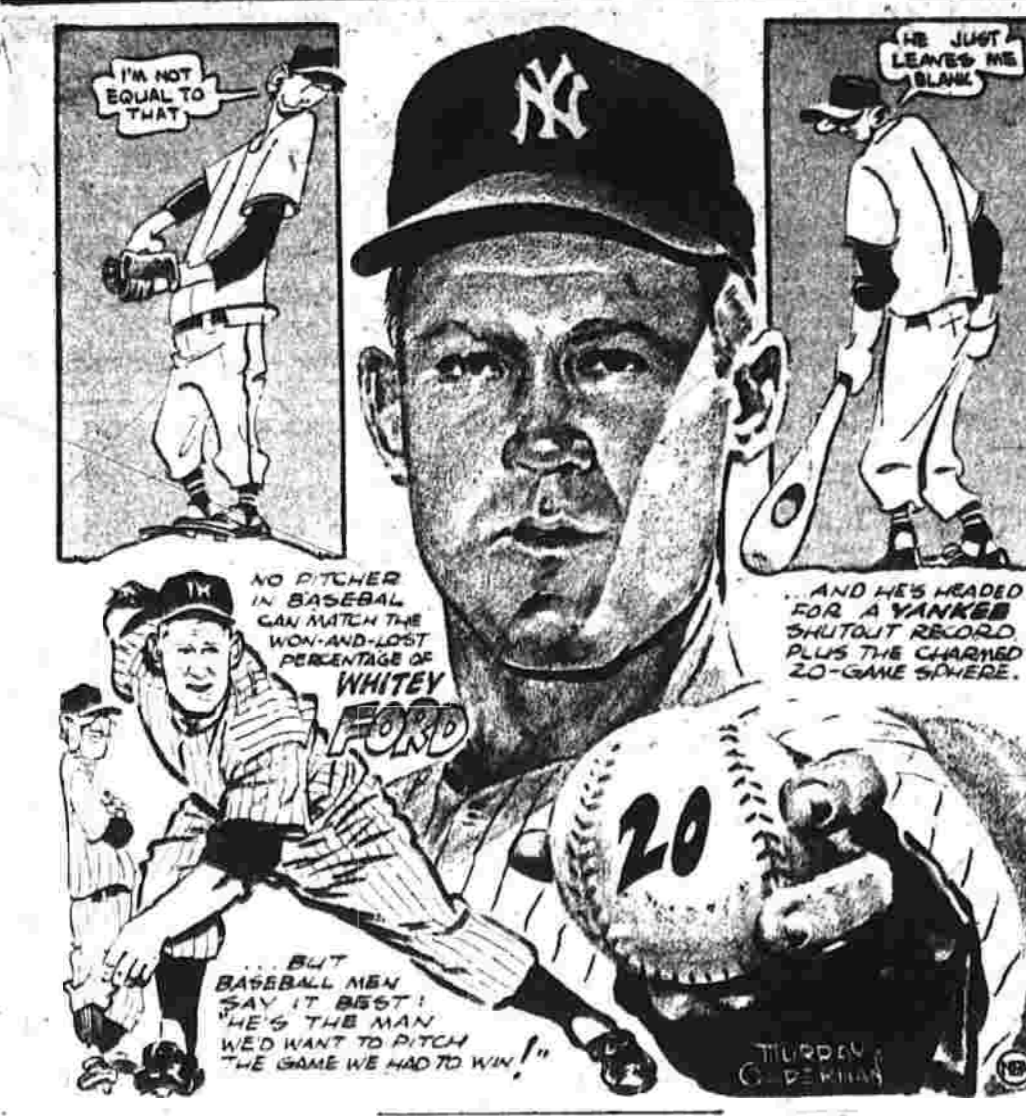
