Columbia 'Plane' Case

'In a special session of Columbia Trial Justice Court last night, Justice Elizabeth D. Hutchins con-tinued for the third time, the "airpiane case" 'against Ned C. Rice, 33, of East Hartford. ordinance concerning aircraft.




