Life in Besieged Town Described by Writer

Balige, Indonesia, Aug. 27 (AP)—What is it like to live in a besieged Indonesian town?

The writer in Balige begins every night at 8 o'clock and the gunfire around the river cracks out about 9.

The high schools are half empty; the two movie houses are closed; there is no newspaper and mail deliveries are few and far between. Balige is a city of 35,000, nestled on the mountains on the edge of Lake Toba, deep in rebellious North Sumatra. It is one of five towns held by the government against Tapanuli Province. The rebel forces began within sight of the city limits.

"We are quite sure we have the rebels haven't tried to take the town—but we don't feel secure," said a young housewife, who has been hiding from her side.

"I don't feel very secure," said the assistant warden (major) of J. Marpung. "There hasn't been much fighting recently, but many of our young men are with the rebels. Prices are high. People don't mind the government troops as long as they behave themselves."

"Things are getting worse," a farmer explained. "We can't send our rice to Medan. We have to burn it up. And prices here are very high because we can't go outside the town."

"The high school kids think it's a big adventure to go with the rebels. They get a gun that makes them feel important . . . and they make 50 rupiah every five days as a patrol," a government soldier said.

"I'd go with the rebels myself if they are my people and many of my friends don't I can leave my family," he added. The local school teacher has been ordered to leave by the rebels. He carried only a flashlight and his own commotion. Balige seems quietly normal during daylight hours. Pipes root in

Alpert said he would meet with officials of New York City and Westchester County, N.Y., and Fairfield County, Conn., within one month to seek some form of relief for the road.

"I think cities, particularly New York, must revise their tax structure if they want to preserve this necessary commuter service," Alpert said. "I don't think the New Haven has a choice. It must have a 15-cent increase in fares."

Video Tape Excellent For TV News Usage

New York, Aug. 27 (AP)—Video tape, the system that enables moving pictures to be recorded and instantly played back without the use of film, is improving television news coverage.

Looking ahead to the 1960 presidential campaign, one can see that tape might help solve some of the problems that beset TV coverage of the 1952 and 1956 conventions. Even the most ardent members of both major parties agree that keeping TV cameras on both candidates continuously in 1960 resulted in some mighty dull viewing.

Commenting on this the other day, Big Mike, general manager of CBS News, remarked: "I'd prefer to edit the convention and use video tape for the less vital parts of the proceedings in 1960. We would, of course, go for balloting and other high lights. You never can overdo the importance, the sense of actuality, shots. It is expected that it will be technically possible to splice tape within two years.

Editorial Coverage
 Although it's much too early to determine exactly how television will cover the 1960 convention, Mike, general manager of CBS News, said it will be difficult to break in that year because of the number of high station markets and single cable lines which had to be shared. All We Galahads

One thing the great and overpowering issue of racial tolerance can do without is the easy assumption of superior virtue on the part of those who have never confronted the problem in its actual terms. Our struggle with ourselves on this issue may determine whether or not we survive as a nation and as a democracy. It is essential that the struggle have a peaceful outcome, that it be fought in the minds of men.

Otherwise, it will inevitably take a shape too horrible to contemplate. But let us have no cheap gladiators in this struggle. Let us not have those who have never confronted the problem in the context of their own living, and who have therefore never had to solve it for themselves by manufacturing the conscience of the problem, superior to those who are facing it, and perhaps having to solve it.

The problem has a way of finding those who make easy claims they have solved it. Little Rock, once again, is everywhere. If it isn't everywhere, it is likely to be there soon.

For a long time, the people of Britain couldn't understand what they thought to be a special American problem, deriving, they seemed to think, from some racial deficiency in our character. Perhaps, they thought, we weren't quite civilized yet.

Recently, certain additions to their own population have given them the problem in its actuality, and they solved it, the other night, in the good old city of Nottingham, with a full scale racial riot, fought with knives, bottles, razors, sticks.

We here in Connecticut think we are pretty advanced on racial issues. We spend a good deal of our time lecturing on the subject of Little Rock. We pride ourselves on the sensible theory that unpleasant things spread and grow faster if you sensationalize them, a racial street fight which, may happen to take place in Hartford, the problem of discrimination which exists in almost every Connecticut community. But Little Rock is here too.

If we ask for solutions, the humility, and for an understanding of just how human is the evil which must be rooted out, that is not to stow down the battle, but rather to try and see that all we Galahads take a good look in that burbled shield we carry, with we are in it not merely the image of our crusading selves, but the image of ourselves, born and brought up in Little Rock. When we are able, in our own honest thoughts and feelings, to merge and reconcile the two images, then we are qualified to go forth and to battle, and then, too, we have a chance of winning, because we will be fighting the problem inside the context rather than from outside it. In such a battle truly fought, there is little room for human condemnation, but much for mutual respect.

Sharing His Losses

Having just railroaded through the Massachusetts Legislature a bill to give his railroad a subsidy of \$900,000 a year for continuing to serve passengers on the Old Colony Line, George Albert, president of the New Haven Road, has understandably begun operations designed to win a similar favor from New York and Connecticut.

Naturally enough, he will want the same kind of subsidy he got in Massachusetts, which is one which puts taxpayer money in his pocket but leaves his railroad strictly a free enterprise venture. Any profitable operation the railroad may have as its own business. Under the new version of a public franchise which is being developed, all profitable use of any particular set of tracks is the railroad's business, but any train which runs on those tracks and loses money because the responsibility of the public.

The holder of a public franchise, under this concept, no longer owes anything to the public for the franchise, and so no longer assumes any general obligation to the public convenience. He enjoys the status of a public carrier, but he himself chooses where and when the public shall be entitled to be carried.

Justice Dept., NAACP Urge Court Lift Integration Bar

Washington, Aug. 28 (AP)—The Justice Department and the NAACP today urged the Supreme Court to lift the integration bar that has kept Little Rock Central High School closed since the school was desegregated.

The Supreme Court opened an extraordinary integration session today and found the Government ranked first alongside the NAACP in urging "no delay" in the lifting of the bar.

The great maroon drapes behind the bench in the marble courtroom parted about noon and to the ancient cry of "Oyez" the Justices walked to their seats.

It was the third crucial session on school segregation within half a decade, and specifically at issue was: Should integration at Central High resume forthwith or be postponed 2 1/2 years. That was the narrow issue but the decision could have profound effect on the whole, far-flung desegregation struggle.

The High Tribunal in 1954 had outlawed school segregation, and in 1955 ordered it wiped out with "all deliberate speed." Now the big question was: "What is deliberate speed?"
