### Martin Receives CD Survival Plan

General Manager Richard Martin today received official notification of the State's Civil Defense survival plan for use in a wartime emergency. The plan, which took more than two years to draft, went into effect Friday when it was signed by Governor Hiram Johnson. Letters making known the plan were sent to all municipal chief executives, state agencies and CD units.

Containing 22 annexes, the master plan provides not only detailed instructions for operations but also provides the maximum instructions in any given situation under the plan.

The three Japanese judges who are hearing the manslaughter trial of Crowley, also of New Haven, Conn., charged with the fatal shooting of a 12-year-old boy in the city, are studying the file of the Japanese autopsy.

The official autopsy report said Jones had a cerebral hemorrhage which caused him to lose consciousness. Crowley's attorney, Arthur K. Mori, told a reporter the defendant was not satisfied with the official autopsy findings.

The court adjourned indefinitely after the law, additional experts were picked. The next trial session is Thursday.

ever sent to the Senate by the normally Republican electorate of the Pine Tree State, the Legislature chose the late Democratic Governor in 1911 before senators were elected by popular ballot.

Clinton C. Chase, former mayor of Waterville, took the governor's seat in 1911. He was elected by a slim margin over Horace A. Hildreth, a GOP former Governor.

James C. Oliver, a Cape Elizabeth real estate man, asked another feather to the Democratic cap by beating out Republican Rep. Robert Hale, who was seeking a ninth term in the house.

Democratic Frank M. Coffin, a Lewiston lawyer, won reelection over Neil S. Burdick, Stockton Springs farmer. Coffin, when first elected two years ago, was the first Maine Democrat to serve in the House in 22 years.

Rep. Clifford G. McEntine, a Portland potato farmer, was the only Republican to major office to survive the Democratic wave. He won reelection over Gerald J. Grady, a professor of government at the University of Maine.

 Congress, third district: McEntine 38,828; Grady 31,324.

The total vote—284,120 for senators—fell far short of forecasts that it would exceed the state election record of 311,488 cast in 1956.

### Zoners Deny Liquor Sales At Pharmacy

If testimonials mean anything, then Maxwell Miller, who operates the Miller Pharmacy at 206 Green St., would probably have won a popularity contest "hands down" at a Zoning Board of Appeals meeting in the Municipal Building last night.

However, despite the praise of more than a dozen of his customers and neighbors and a petition in his favor bearing the signatures of more than 800 persons, the pharmacist failed to achieve his goal—a variance which would allow him to sell liquor in his drug store.

By a three to two vote, the board denied Miller's request. It was the third time the pharmacist had tried for the variance and the refusal was based, as in the past, on the fact his store is in a Business Zone I which does not allow liquor stores.

**Reason for Denial**  
 The members of the board who turned down Miller's request, felt that the zone had been established by the Town Planning Commission for a definite purpose, that granting of such a variance would tend to "destroy the integrity" of the zone and would be contrary to the ZPC's intention.

In presenting arguments why he should be granted the license, Miller pointed out there are 880 drug stores in the State which sell liquor, that there was no liquor store within a 1,000 feet of his store, and that he would convert the second floor of a

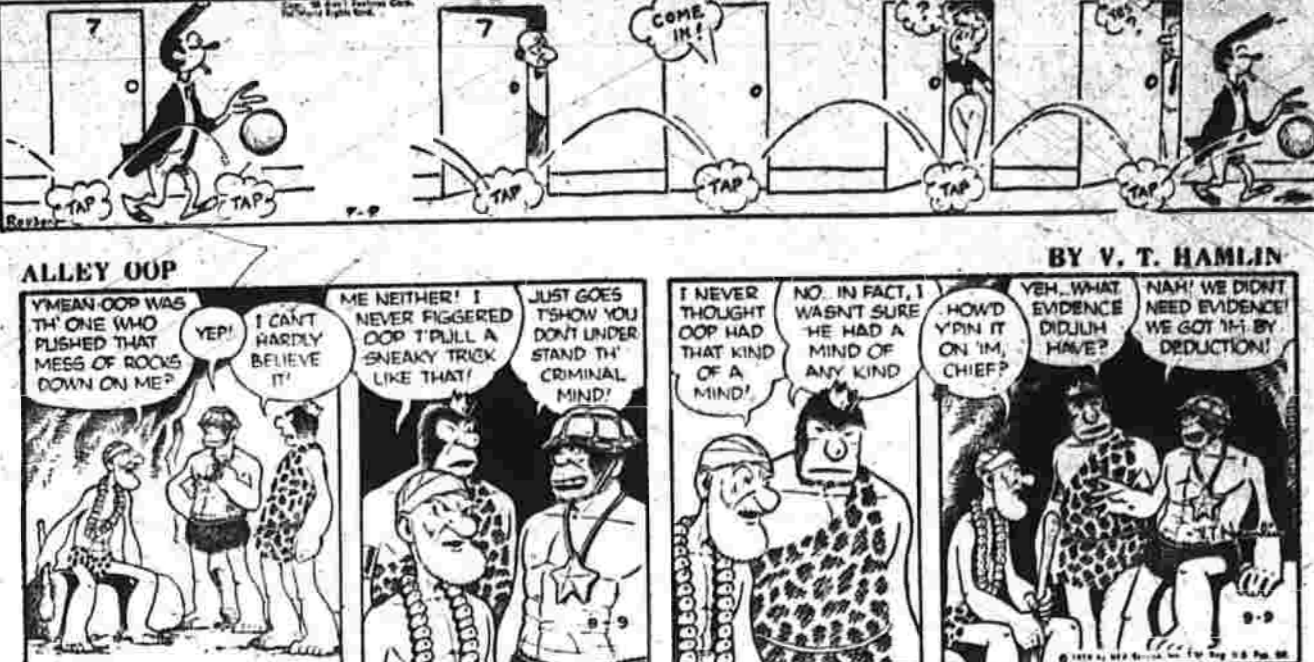

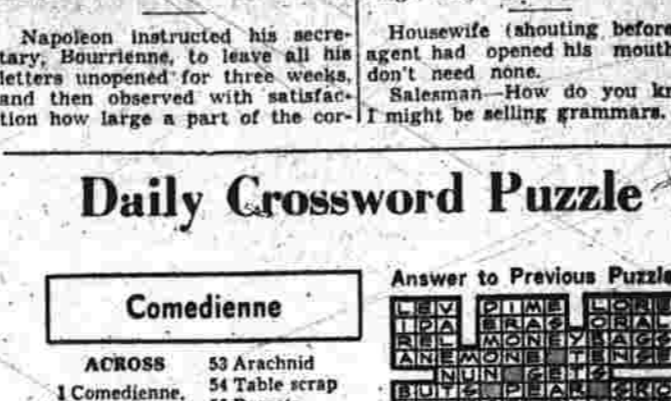
