





In a new message to Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev, Eisen-hower criticized the Kremlin lead-er for what he called a "one-sided denunciation" of United states policy in the Far East. At the same time, Elsenhower made it perfectly clear that the U.S. has no intention of pulling its forces out of the Far East, as Khrushchey demanded early this thrushchev demanded early this Referring to Khrushchev's 4,000-word letter to him, Elsenhower "I regret to say I do not see your letter any effort to find that ommon language which could in deed facilitate the removal of the anger existing in the current situa on in the Taiwan (Formosa) area. I also note that you have addressed no letter to the Chinese Communists leaders
