Ribicoff called on the General Asembly to give new consideration to administration proposals of a safety code and mandatory fire drills, both of which were rejected by the 1957 Legislature.

In a speech prepared for the Safety Awards ceremony at the annual convention of the Motor Transport Association of Connecticut, the Governor said Connecticut ranked second lowest in the nation last year in deaths from accidents of all kinds — traffic, occupational and home. al and home. The rate was 38 deaths per 100.

The rate was 38 deaths per 100,000 population — compared with the national rate of 55.8.

The governor cited the 1957 New Haven factory fire, in which 15 persons were killed and more than a score injured, as spotlighting the need for further safety measures.

Enactment of the safety code, covering all factories, workshops and other industrial paints, plus the requiring of fire exit drills, "will furnish added evidence that Connecticut will never leave the safety of a single life to chance," he said.





Cape Canaveral, Fla., Sept. 26 (P)-A weather probing Navy Vanguard satellite was blasted into space today and oreliminary instrumentation showed the rocket's three engines performed normally. That meant the huge rocket blazed some 300 miles high in space, probably reaching a speed of 18,000 miles per hour. An official announcement said, however, that it was not yet known whether orbital height was obtained. This should be determined within about 219 hours.
