Wilmington, N. C., Sept. 27 (P)-Hurricane Helene aimed he fury of her winds and waters toward North Carolina's southeastern coast late this morning. This "dangerous" hurricane, her central winds spinning 125 miles an hour, was located at 10 a.m. 40 miles south of Cape Fear, a point of land jutting into the seething At-

lantic 30 miles south of Wilmington. The storm's forward speed was 10 miles an hour.
