This leaves Sekou Toure pretty much alone with his 2½ million Fullah, Malinke and Soussou tribesmen.

"Even if France wants to abandon Guinea, she will remain despite herself," Toure said. "Colonization has its positive things. We will keep French culture. We want to stay in the franc zone.

"For the moment we aren't even thinking about our own money, nor even our own flag," he said.
