7 (P)—Pope Pius XII had a slight return of fever today after a surprising rally from a stroke. But a medical bulletin said his condition continued generally satisfactory.

By FRANK BRUTTO Castel Gandolfo, Italy, Oct.
7 (P)—Pope Pius XII rallied today. He was lucid. His fever today. He was lucid. His fever abated and his respiration was normal. He ate solid food. The \$2-year-old head of the Roman Catholic Church, felled yesterday by a cerebal stroke, recognized persons in his sickroe; and spoke a few words.

"There are no signs of motor deficiency," a medical bulletin said. This indicated that the partial paralysis which accompanied the stroke had ended.

When his temperature was taken, the Pope himself removed the thermometer from his mouth to read it. read it.
Physicians said he ate cereal broth and shredded chicken.

A medical bulletin indicated to Pope's tremendous continuing re-sistance to his second serious ill-

ness in four years.

There were cautious expressions of hope he could recover.

One of his doctors said at noon that if his condition continued to improve further medical bulletins might be postponed until tomor-The Pope had recovered from a kidney block, which for a time had threatened dangerous compli-



Wang was understood to have given not the slightest hint to Beam, when they met last Saturday, that Peiping's cease-fire proposal was in the offing.

Speculate on Motives

Officials studying the statement announcing the cease-fire speculated on its motivation. Two aspects seemed fairly clear.

One of these was its propaganda tone. It called on the Nationalist Chinese to join forces against "our common enemy," the United States. This was renewed.

"Any trick that the United U.S. Radio Peiping announced Chen spoke at a reception given by East German Ambassador Paul Wandel honoring the ninth anniversary of the founding of Communist East Germany.

Premier Chou En-lai attended. Chen said the United States should not "misniterpret this (suspension of bombardment) as meeting its demand for a cease-fire. He said the Chinese people are determined to liberate Formosa, the Pescadores, Quemoy and Maisu.

"No foreign interference will be to crated at all," he said.

## Long Waited Win Elates Democrats
