Just keep the platter handy for the opponents to use when they hand a trick right back to you, West opened the six of hearts, and declarer played low from the dummy. 





Side Street Sewer Cost Not Figured for Tract

Water and Sewer Department Superintendent Fred Thrall said yesterday afternoon it would have been impossible Tuesday night to give accurate estimates of sewering side streets in the Woodridge tract.

Thrall said such figures would have been available at a public hearing that evening only it the town had decided to sewer the side streets as part of a proposed \$150.000 sewer project in the northwest section of town. That, however, wasn't the case.

The project, and the hearing called on it, concerned only a \$100.000 pumping station and force main to be built on the south side of W. Middle Thike, east of the Hockanum River, and a \$50,000 12-linch sanitary sewer on W. Middle Thike, from Hilliard St. to Deerfield Dr.

Up to the present, the town had not made plans to sewer the side streets, which lay between W. Middle Thike, and Center St. However, residents at the hearing protented because they weren't given figures on:

1. The cost of side street sewers.
2. Individual costs of connecting houses with sewers in the street.
3. The cost of additional pump stations, if needed.

Director Paul Marte criticized Thrall and General Manager Richard Martin for not having these figures at the hearing. The hearing was adjourned upon Marte's proposal that the figures be made available, and yesterday he said he would ask that the project be expanded to include all side streets sewers.
