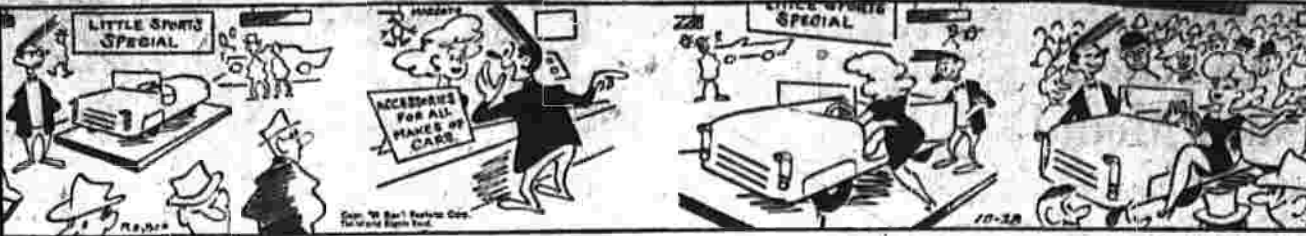

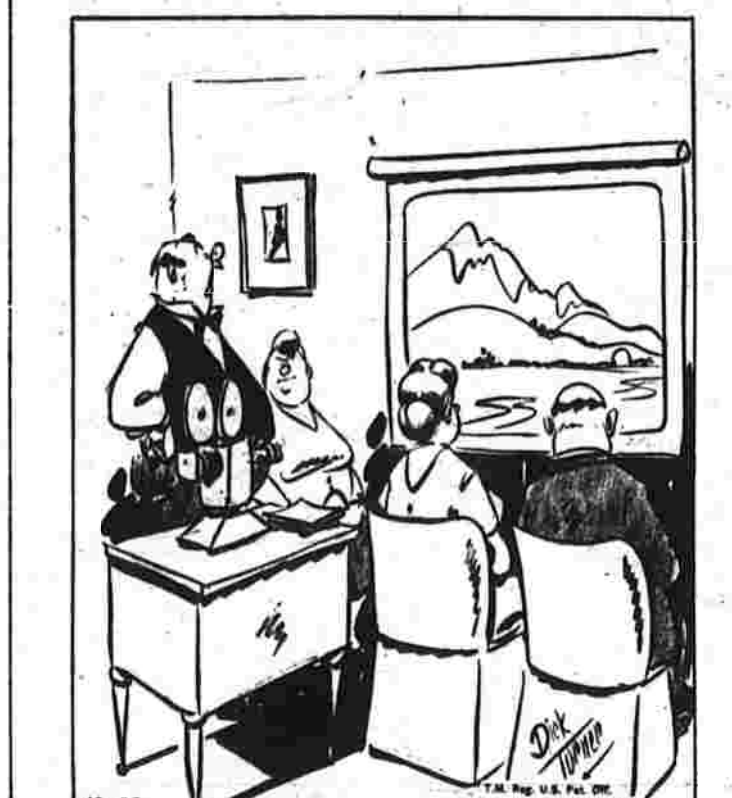

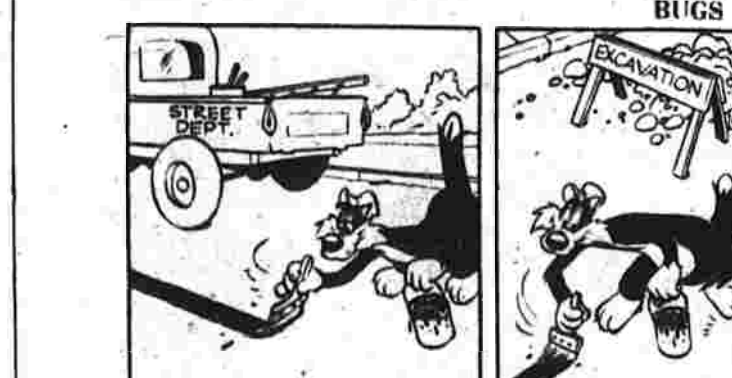

Football Still Getting Big Kick in the Game

Army Drops to Third, Louisiana State Leads

New York, Oct. 28 (AP)—Three teams in the top 10 of the Associated Press weekly college football poll are unbeaten and one of them will have its record spread next Saturday.

Louisiana State, which displaced Army at No. 1 from this week, is in a three-game week taking on Mississippi No. 6 at Baton Rouge Saturday night and one of them will have the first berth on its record when the first game ends.

Colorado is the only other team in the top 10 with a winning record and it is in dire peril. The Buffs are only No. 6 and Oklahoma is at Boulder. The Sooners, No. 7 and with a one-point deficit, have been picked to meet the Buffs in a rematch on the first game of the season.

Army dropped to third place, Auburn moved up from fifth to fourth and Ohio State, No. 2, a week ago dropped to fifth. The result of its tie with Wisconsin.

The result of the tie was selected by the sportswriters and sportscasters taking part in the poll were, in order: Mississippi, Oklahoma, Wisconsin, Colorado and Purdue.
