LaBelle of Manchester, carried Manchester by 245 votes while winning re-election by a margin of 1,129 votes—28,517 to 27,388. Watson won pluralities in every town excopt East Hartford, a Democratic stronghold, and Rocky Hill.

The underground explosion, dubbed Blanca, was touched off in a tunnel that had been dug 2,500 feet into the side of a mound and under a mesa.
