### U.S. Attorneys To Be at Posts Election Hours

Washington, Oct. 29 (AP)—Atty. Gen. Rogers announced today that all federal district attorneys have been instructed to keep their offices manned election day, Nov. 4, as long as the polls in their districts are open.

He directed the prosecutors to act promptly on all reports of violations of federal election laws on the day.

The Justice Department's Civil Rights Division will as usual be staffed into the night until the last polls in the country have closed, Rogers said. He explained the headquarters here will thus be available to supply advice to the field at all times. The division is specifically charged with election law enforcement.

The attorney general reiterated responsibility for the conduct of elections rests with the states and that the federal government is without authority for general supervision of voting, however, he asserted.

Where violations of federal statutes occur, the Department of Justice will promptly and vigorously take prosecutive action.

In the global competition between the U.S. and the Soviet bloc, he said, it is imperative that the federal government be able to choose their electors with the greatest care.

"Any fraud or corruption detected in the process of the election will be checked by the leadership of the federal government as a failure of our free system. This must not happen."

"Every citizen of the United States has been directed to be particularly watchful in the reporting of any act upon reports concerning the inclusion of names on the ballot as well as from casting ballots as their free will dictates. In addition, reports dealing with false or fraudulent ballots or other means used to prevent a ballot from being counted as cast, will receive full attention."

"No responsible complaint of discrimination, ballot-box tampering or other possible federal violation will be disregarded."

The meeting will start with a tea and coffee hour at 8:30 a.m., and the program will be held from 10 to 11 o'clock.

Mrs. Bourn's talk will include a review of the history of antiques and examples of types of antiques people collect, antiques in modern living and the oddities of collecting.

By deciding to authorize the expansion, it will mean an overall increase of 45 per cent. The proposed expansion program involves an increase of \$114,500 for diocesan mission work in addition to an increase in the amount of money to be raised for the special purpose.

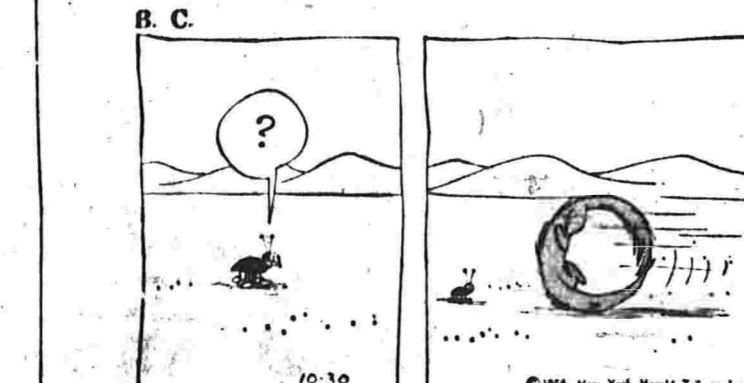
