view, they should then be able to successfully analyze the problem of preventing the mass destruction weapons from being used with surprise. They would design a system of ground and aerial inspection teams which in theory, at least, would let the Soviet Union know what is going on in military developments in the West from day to day and let the western powers know similarly what is happening behind the Iron Curtain.

Russia's approach to this problem was stated in earlier news and declarations in that the experts should take at the outset operations of specific zones such as a Communist province in the United States and a nuclear-free zone in eastern Europe.

The delineation of any zone involves serious political questions and the United States and its allies are prepared to argue that such matters should be delayed until a second conference. This would follow almost automatically if the U. S. should meet with the Soviet Union.

Experts are willing to have international control points on key territories in order to monitor the Soviet delegate Benjamin Tsushin has had a delegation of British military experts to Cuba.

The source said a news conference today about an agreement with Tsushin. He did not say whether Soviet troops would be ordered to control posts in her territory by Soviet citizens, they reported.

American, British and Soviet delegates remained their formal conference at the Palace of Nations in Geneva. The first has today after a several of private exchanges. The meeting this afternoon will be held closed doors.

At United Nations' S. Y. India and Yugoslavia sought Russian and American agreement today to a plan to revive the U. N. Disarmament Commission, the latter more than a year because of a Soviet boycott.

Arthur S. Hall of India and Debraj Bose of Yugoslavia planned morning conferences with American and Soviet delegates to the U. N. Assembly in an effort to work out a resolution acceptable to both.

Lall and Bose hoped to get the resolution through the Assembly itself would meet tomorrow afternoon to give final approval to the new proposal as well as three others already adopted in the committee.

The Indian Yugoslav resolution would have the Assembly enlarge the disarmament commission to include all 12 UN members but only for 1959 and as a committee of the General Assembly rather than as a permanent commission.

The Soviet Union has declined to all on the present 25-nation commission because Communist and neutral members are outnumbered by Western Allied members. It has demanded either an eventful balanced commission or one of all 12 countries.

Britain and the United States last year opposed the idea of an 81-nation commission, contending
