## West Not to Resume, Says Self-Ban Lifted

Washington, Nov. 7 (AP)-The United States and Britain announced today they have detected two Russian nuclear weapons tests since Oct. 31 when the western countries pro-

visionally suspended such trials for a year. The development further clouded the outlook in Geneva where the atomic powers are sparring over the question o what to talk about first in negotiations over a formal end to nuclear testing. The Reds want agreement on a permanent ban before the conferees consider enforcement measures. The West wants it the other way around.

The proviso in the U.S. and British one-year suspension was that the Soviets also stop testing. Both countries said the new Russian tests, detected or Nov. 1 and Nov. 3, release them from their self-imposed






