Democrats Ahead In All Top Races Of Alaska Election

Juneau, Alaska, Nov. 26 (AP)—A smashing Democratic victory in Alaska's first state election emerged today as Democrats mounted from the Yukon northern territory's 287 precincts.

Democrats led in all major races and were assured of overwhelming majorities in the Legislature.

Less than half of the estimated total vote of about 40,000 in yesterday's general election had been reported, but big city precincts still were considered sure to reinforce the steadily growing Democratic lead.

Republicans still had a chance in the major contest between Democrat Ernest Gruening and Republican Mike Steptoe for governor.

But Gruening, appointed governor in 1955, has a record of 14 years in office.

Steptoe, 42, is a former member of the Alaska House of Representatives.
