and Lockheed, have been working on a design for an atomic airplane for several years. A design is expected, possibly by the end of this year, at which design will be possible.

The nuclear-powered plane is a military airplane and just a conventional plane fitted with an experimental nuclear power plant for test purposes, the report said.

The nuclear power plant was described as the simplest kind of an atomic engine, a direct air cycle engine similar to that used in turbojet engines except that a nuclear reactor is used to heat the air.

The design test station expects completion by next fall of facilities to test the engine in conjunction with an air frame on the ground. No date for flight testing of a nuclear-powered plane has been announced.

Aviation Week said the Russian plane is powered with two nuclear reactors and two conventional engines. The nuclear plants are designed to operate at 3,000 degrees and the jets 3,000 each. Speeds were estimated at just above or below the speed of sound.

The magazine said the plane weighs 20,000 pounds, is 100 feet long and has a wingspan of 78 feet. It has a maximum speed of 4,000 miles an hour and a 10,000-mile range.
