## 1,000 Miles Slow To Escape Gravity

By VERN HAUGHLAND

Cape Canaveral, Fla., Dec. 6 (A)-The Army launched a 13-pound gold plated cone thousands of miles into the sky today. But its fate was uncertain. Scientists said it wasn't traveling fast enough or in a high enough trajectory to carry it to the far reaches of space. However, as of 5:15 a.m. (EST) the space agency in Washington estimated it had reached 40,000 miles from earth.


