1,000 Miles Slow To Escape Gravity By VERN HAUGHLAND

Cane Canaveral, Fla., Dec. 6 (P)-The Army launched a 13-pound gold plated cone thousands of miles into the sky today. But its fate was uncertain.

Scientists said it wasn't traveling fast enough or in a high enough trajectory to carry it to the far reaches of space. However, as of 5:15 a.m. (EST) the space agency in Washington estimated it had reached 40,000 miles from earth. Dr. T. Keith Glennan, head of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, told a news conference here three hours after the firing that the 60-ton rocket carrier failed by 1,000 miles an hour to achieve the nearly 25,000 miles an hour speed needed to pull clear of the earth's main gravita-




