Papers Hit By Strike In Gotham

New York, Dec. 11 (AP)—Presses of New York's major daily newspapers were stalled today as the papers discontinued publication in the face of a strike by their delivery men.

Last to call of efforts to keep limited publications going were the five afternoon papers published in Manhattan and Queens. They were the World-Telegram and Sun, the Journal-American, the Post and the Long Island Press (Six-Journal).

Earlier the Daily News, a morning paper, skipped an edition after composing room workers defied their union president and refused to cross deliverymen's picket lines.

Two other morning papers, the Times and the Herald Tribune, suspended publication after their final editions were out.

The same remains of the day's news were out. The morning paper, the Mirror, did not announce immediately its plans but was expected to follow leadership of the others in halting publication.

The strike, now in its second day, has swept newsstands clean of major newspapers. There is no prospect of negotiations to end the strike until a meeting set for tomorrow.

The Times, referring to refusal of printers to cross picket lines at the News, said in a statement to its own readers:

"Such a refusal is the equivalent of a strike against the News as well as against the newspaper and all other members of the Publishers Association of New York City who are parties to the contract with the printing union."

The Times said that "it is obvious that this concerted refusal to work can be extended to us."

Printers' Federation leaders said they would not be forced to work until further notice and added that they might receive a call from the union in the next few days.

Detectives said last night the blast apparently was timed off by the cult's leader, Jim Jones, 33, and Peter Kanner, 42, both of Joshua Tree, Calif.

The recordings made in the days before the bombing indicate they were angry at the leader of the cult, Krishna Venya, and wanted to "bring him to justice," officers said.

Washington, Dec. 11 (AP)—A federal district judge today ordered the Teamsters Union to comply with reform orders of court-appointed monitors.

The union was barred from holding a scheduled new convention next March.

Judge J. Dickinson Latta upheld complaints of a 2-man majority of the three monitors that the union under president James R. Hoffa had failed to comply in good faith with reform orders.

Hoffa had nothing to say immediately on the ruling. He is in Miami for meetings of the Teamsters executive board.

An aide said the board would meet at 2:30 p.m. to study the decision and any countermeasures to be taken without waiting for the monitors' next report.

Latta noted that the monitors are officers of the court and subject to the court's supervision, and they have all powers necessary to carry out their duties.

The monitors are to be held in contempt if they fail to comply with the court's orders.

Dr. Moran Still Favors Town-Operated Course

The Board of Directors of the Recreation Department last night heard ideas of several townpeople on what should be done with the golf course of the Manchester Country Club.

Right now, he said, the town is looking for money and, in effect, "subsidizing" the club.

He cited figures he claims show that the club occupies the land under its present status as "tenant at will," paying some \$7,500 yearly to the town.

A third question whether the town might sell part of the course was the only question to receive a definite answer at the committee hearing in the Municipal Building. The answer was no.

The committee heard Dr. A. B. Moran and Rudolph Carlson, who demand municipal operation of the course, and Stuart H. V. Carlson, who said he wants to buy the course and operate it as a private operation.

What Club's Proposal

After the hearing, the committee decided to request from the club a definite proposal stating whatever arrangement it might desire in the way of municipal use of the club's course and facilities, which are located on town-owned land.

The land became town property with the Globe Hollow purchase in 1955 and the club's status on it has become a well-grounded bone of contention since then.

Some members last night felt a definite proposal from the club will help to settle the observations and comments they have made so far in a systematic way of what to do with the course.

Members have been consulting town officials and agencies, operators of out-of-town courses, and a club negotiating committee in an effort to reach a recommendation to the full Board of Directors expected next month.

Dr. Moran, who has taken a strong interest in the Country Club matter, repeated once again last night that he wants "A municipally operated course providing equal privileges for all and special privileges for none."

Oliver News Course

He said he would not object if the club were to build a new course on unoccupied land in the Globe Hollow tract, which is the main private. In fact, Moran added that he would support a recommendation to the town to acquire the land in such a way. "If it should be allowed to occupy the land rent-free," he said.

GOP Rules Unit Denies Role of Hatchmen

The Republican Town Committee was told last night that the recently appointed Rules Revision Committee is not "a hatchmen committee."

Eugene N. Kelly, chairman of the new group, pointed out that all town committee members have been elected for a 2-year period and that it is not the job of the committee to request or recommend resignation. He said he was seeking to put to rest rumors about forced resignations that began circulating after the local party's two defeats at the polls.

However, he also said that the aim of the new group is to provide for a strengthened town committee, one that consists entirely of workers. "If you want to be on the Town Committee, you will have to be a working member," he said.

"There will be no room for anyone else," he said.

There will be no rules change until the 1960 caucus, according to Kelly. He said any proposals advanced by the committee will be in the form of recommendations for that caucus. Thus far, the Rules Revision Committee has had only one meeting.

In the meantime, however, steps are being taken under the present rules, toward strengthening the District organizations—an important aspect of the revitalization program that has been prescribed for the town committee by local leaders. Among other things, district chairmen have agreed to arrange social functions to keep their organizations "active and alive" throughout the year. The first of these affairs is to start soon after the first of the year.

Autonomous District

Town Committee Vice Chairman John Bowen said that party leaders feel the decentralized town committee which they have proposed will make for a more efficient organization than the present one. "I think the town committee will have far more autonomy than they do now, and district chairmen, far more," he said.

However, no recommendations have yet been agreed upon in detail, and the Rules Revision Committee is receiving copies of party proposals which have been filed.

Mr. Bowen said that last night, authorized to appoint a committee to come up with a recommendation as to how the committee could function in the bank account.

Mr. Kelly reported that the committee had 1789 left after spending about \$3,000 in the October and November campaigns. Committee to Study Outdoor Pool Needs

Kelly and Kelly—Mayor Eugene T. Thomas V.—were the principals in a lengthy discussion last night which ended in agreement to "get the ball rolling" toward realization of outdoor swimming facilities in Manchester.

One result of the 1 1/2 hour session at which the Advisory Park and Recreation Commission met with Mayor Kelly and General Manager Richard E. Martin, was agreement that the mayor would appoint a Board of Directors subcommittee to explore the outdoor swimming problem. Once appointed, the subcommittee will study the problem and make recommendations to the Recreation Department.

The 2-300 proposal came about after Kelly and Martin both reached on a proposal that no one but two pools be promoted in town.

In explanation, Martin selected a figure of \$300,000. Over a 15-year period, he said, it would cost about \$20,000 each year, less than one-third of a mill rise in the tax rate.

"No matter what the eventual proposal is," Martin said, "this whole problem needs careful study, more thorough than the study that went into the Globe Hollow plan."

"There must be concrete proposals backed up with sound arguments," he said, "and there must be an organized public relations campaign to make it sell."

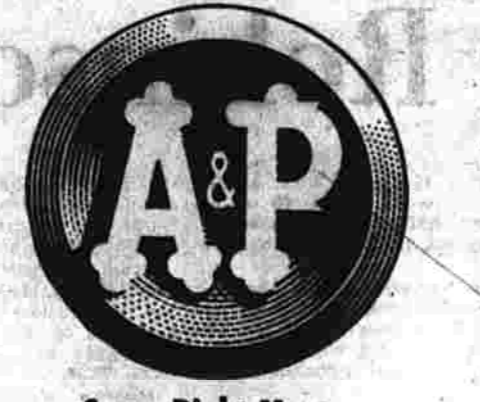
