

Andover Firemen Place Tank On Surplus Chassis

(Herald Photo by Pfanzagl) The town's volunteer fire department clinched a major "debut" job yesterday. Transfer of the tank to a 1957 surplus Army GMC truck purchased last year.

The tank was out of commission for only two days. A team of about 20 men working the night shift from the tank's chassis was removed from the truck which the department had bought second hand ten years ago. A number of pieces of equipment used in the transferring operation was a small power shovel of the Andover Fire Tank Co. now owned by Louis Paine.

The newer truck chassis has more horsepower and more torque than the old one. These advantages are considered essential in this town which recently received its name from the phrase "and over the hills." The new chassis has only 4,000 miles on its speedometer.

Despite the quick change-over to an operational status, the "new" tank is not in parade dress yet. It is not expected that finishing touches will be added until various phases of the new assembly job have been checked out. The new coat of paint was put on the chassis Saturday night replacing the Army olive drab.

Unique in This Area
This type of combination of chassis and tank is considered unique in this area. A great deal of consideration was given to the project before the actual work began on it six months ago. Since then, several nights have been spent each week on it by department volunteers. The preliminary work included a complete overhaul of the brake system and changing of the lighting system.

The pumping system is based on a new power take-off 2 1/2 gallon per minute pressure pump which the men modified to suit the new arrangement. The pump, like much of the fire department equipment was purchased out of the department's own funds, without town assistance.

Work on the transfer operation began at 8 a. m. yesterday and continued until 6 p. m. with some men remaining all day. Lunches were served by the department's refreshment committee with the cooperation of Mrs. Joseph Donner, town and Mrs. Alfred Gill.

The department has arranged for insurance on the tanker to be changed over to meet the new description.

Other equipment of the local department includes a 4-wheel drive pumper purchased last year and a rescue emergency truck.

Army Helicopters Set New Record

Fort Rucker, Ala. — Four cargo helicopters set an Army record during recent tests at the Army Aviation Center here. Two Sikorski HO4S and two Sikorski HO4D logged a total of 4,000 hours in the air, the equivalent of 12 years of normal Army service, during an 80-day period.

Flying on a seven-day-a-week schedule with three shifts of pilots during each 24-hour period, they flew an average of 15 hours, 11 minutes daily. Missions called up were equal to 12 trips around the world.

More than once the four choppers flew 44 hours out of 48 with inspections performed during refueling. At the end of the 48 hours all were back on the 3-hour flight schedule.

Preliminary studies of the tests indicate that the service life of some helicopters may be extended by as much as 200 hours, with considerable monetary savings in the case of expensive parts and that the flight availability of the aircraft can be vastly increased with the newly tested maintenance procedures.

The Doctor Says

An enormous amount of research has been conducted on the subject of stuttering and other speech defects.

It is a sad condition, constituting one of the largest groups of handicapped people in the world. One out of every 100 children is afflicted with it. It is a condition which is not inherited but is the nervous constitution of some children makes them more susceptible to speech difficulties.
