Rebel broadcasts claimed the apture of Trinidad a Las Villas Province hill town of 15,000 about 45 miles south of Santa Clara. They said government troops were driven out

Shortly after noon, Cuban Navy planes started machinegunning and bombing rebel positions i Trinidad, called the Toledo of Cuba because of its ancient Spanis archilecture These developments came after the flurry in Havana over the dy-

namite blast. Rebel sympathizers here say they have 5,000 armed partisans within the city. They declared there would be startling developments soon in Havana regardless of the outcome of relel leader Fidel Castro's battle to seize Santa Clara and cut Cuba in two.
