The two children of Mr. and Mrs. Royce Hollister of Coventry died when flames swept through their 1-story house in the Bellevue section at 8 a.m. today. Dead are Royce Hollister Jr., 4, and his sister, Virginial 2.

Coventry Medical-Examiner Dr. Robert P. Bowen said the hildren apparently suffocated in their bedroom from intense smoke. He said that burns on their bodies did not appear to be severe enough to have caused death. However, he said he will make an examination later today to be sure of the cause of their-deaths.
