



A. "Mastitis" means inflammation of breast tissue. Chronic indicates that the condition has been present for quite some time. Mild breast inflammation, which shows up as a tender spot or lump is often due to repeated slight injury as might be produced by a tight bra. In chronic cystic mastitis there are breast lumps but not much inflammation. The lumps may be of almost any size and may or may not be tender. 


