We now have available a safe method for the par control of dental caries This is a safe measure. Studies of community populations who have lived with the concentration of fluoride in the water which is planned for our community have revealed that there is no demon-

strable relationship between water fluoridation and the length of human life.

To call fluoride rat poison is to beg the issue. Many drugs in propdosage are life saving, but inlarge doses are deadly poisons. Even such an essential as water itself, if taken in too great quantities under given conditions can cause a loss of essential body electrolytes with harmful effects and even death, No

one needs to be reminded that water, as ordinarily consumed is not a poison. So it is with the proposed usage of sodium fluoride. At the rate of one part per million it is not a poison.

In the interest of fair play and with due regard for the intelligence of our readers may I suggest that any further communications to the editor be honest and truthful state-

In this regard it should be mentioned that hearings on this aubject were held in February, 1958 before the General Manager and that several members of the present Board attended them. Two evenings, instead of the usual one. were given over to the matter. and the entire proceedings were ecorded for the benefit of the Board of Directors then in office, and for the use of all subsequently elected Directors. Both hearings were well publicized by promine articles in The Herald. Of further interest is the fact that one of the members of the Taxpayers' League freely admitted that if another hearing were to be held on fluoridation, the same arguments would he repeated on each side. The right of the voters to over-rule the Directors is provided in ur Charter. When the Directors have made a decision a petition to overrule is by definition an act of opposition. Yet the Taxpayers' Lasgue, while circulating its petition, professes neutrality on a question that has already been decided in a perfectly democratic

One can only conclude that their neutrality is either naive or calculated to deceive, It may interest you to know that following a referendum on fluoridation in another city not long ago, the city fathers decided to study the reasons behind the referendum and were amazed to discover that a mere dozen people were respon-sible for it.
