### Bolton School Board Head Praises New Policy on Bid Controls





The big speech at this dinner was an open attack on the Franco regime. The dinner itself was followed three days later, by the formal announcement of a new political party, calling itself the "Spanish Union". The organization of political parties in Spain is itself something forbidden by law.

Such developments present Franco with rather hot alternatives. In a meeting that will be interpreted as a sign of weakness, which will in turn encourage more active activity against him. If he arrests the distinguished citizens who dared meet openly against him, the minimum result will be unfavorable publicity, and the maximum result could be to produce revolution itself.

One strategy apparently is not open to him. He does not seem to be beginning to sound just as tough as some of our own military or political hothouse has sometimes made us. But apparently by Russia was being relatively civilized with regard to threats to others only during the period when it was not really sure of its own might. Now Russia presumably has the striking power. Its generals are beginning to sound just as tough as some of ours sounded, when they thought they had the power to blast Russia off the map without too much trouble.

There was a long period during which Russia had to take it as we can, in turn, endure having Russia flex its missile power.

But there is one thing we would like to have the Russians remember. We would like to have them go back and survey the period during the long period when we had our clear military dominance over Russia, with an exclusive atomic bomb, and then with planes and bases which gave us a clear edge even after Russia had acquired the bomb for itself.

Let the Russians tell themselves what, if any, adjustment of Russian policy, what Russian change of diplomatic position, what Russian yielding to our American "situation of strength" ever took place during this period when the dominant power and the bomb about it were ours. # Lemon Meringue Valentine

Your best bet has probably been chosen your Valentine. How about returning the compliment?

The best way to know is to start your heart on Cupid's Day as usual, through something delectable to taste.

We have yet to find the man who doesn't enjoy a sweet meringue filled with a tangy lemon cream. It's not a surprising recipe to be sure, but it does bear repeating.

To suit the day, it's simple to make the meringue an appropriate shape. No special pan needed. This is how we do it: Fold a piece of brown paper 10 inches wide and 11 inches long in half and cut out a heart pattern. Now line a large cookie sheet with heavy-duty foil. Place the pattern on the foil, mark around the foil, and cut through the foil. Remove the pattern. Now your heart shape is ready to fill with meringue and bake. Here's the recipe for the shell and the wonderful filling.

**Valentine Lemon Cream Meringue**  
Ingredients: 4 egg whites, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon cream of tartar, 1 cup sugar, Lemon Cream Filling, Strawberry and Lemon Garnish.

Method: In a large mixing bowl beat egg whites and salt until foamy. Add cream of tartar and continue beating until whites hold curved peaks. Add sugar, 1/2 spoon at a time, beating after each addition, continue beating until whites are very thick. Beat in cream and hold firm straight peaks. Spoon meringue onto heart pattern marked on foil. Place meringue sheet, building up sides and accented corners. Bake in oven at 275 degrees for 1 hour. Turn off oven. Keep oven door closed and allow meringue to stand in shut-off oven 1 hour. Then remove meringue and peel off foil. Place meringue heart on flat serving dish, and arrange fancy slices of lemon and whole strawberries in center. Tucked in small green leaves also look pretty in the center garnish.

**Lemon Cream Filling**  
Ingredients: 4 egg yolks, 1/2 cup sugar, salt, 1/2 cup water, 1 cup lemon juice, 1 teaspoon grated lemon rind, 1 cup heavy cream, 1/2 cup thick and lemon-colored, beat in sugar, a dash of salt, water and lemon juice. Cook and stir constantly over hot (not boiling) water until curd is thick and spoon-able, about 15 minutes. Remove from heat; stir in lemon rind. Cover and set aside to cool. Whip cream; add into cooled lemon curd. Use as filling for meringue heart.

**Cook's Help**  
The heart-shaped meringue shell may be made and baked covered with airtight moisture-proof wrapping and stored in the freezer. When it is to be served, it should be unwrapped and thawed at room temperature for several hours, then the lemon filling may be added.

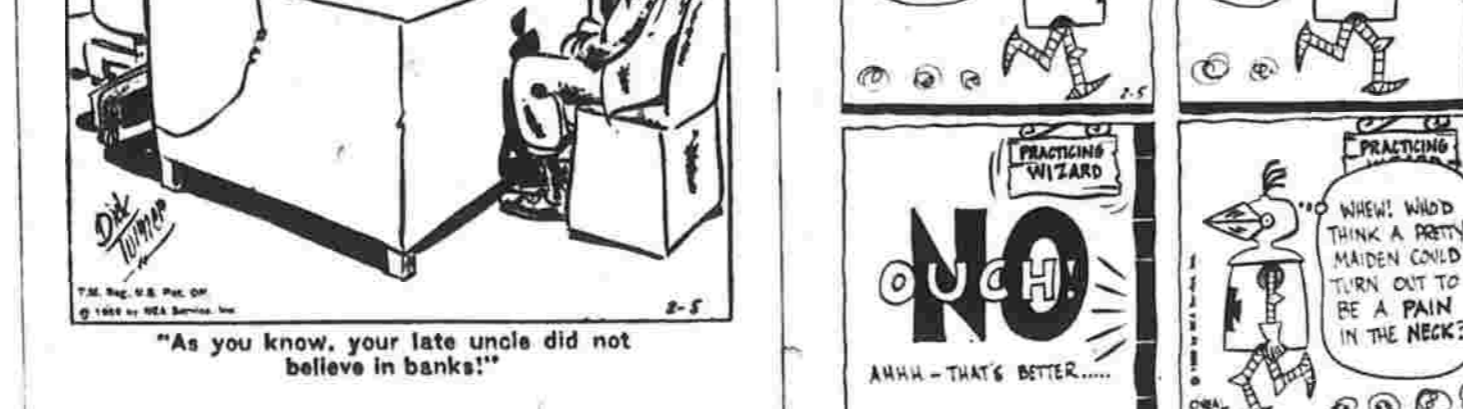

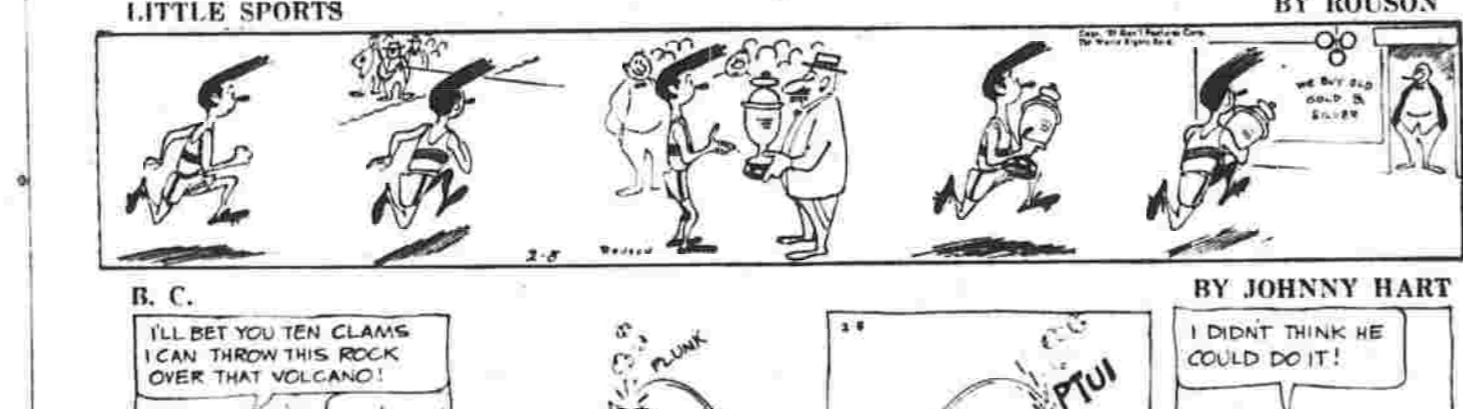
