At the same time he renewed the West's offer to talk about a general settlement. "We are willing to talk with the Soviets in a sincere ef-

fort to reach agreements," he said. Dulles returned to Washington at 8 a.m., aboard a U.S. Air Force plane from talks at London, Paris and Bonn,

The Secretary said he was reporting promptly to President Eisenhower. In a prepared statement Dulles told newsmen his talks abroad "reconfirmed the unity and firmness of our position."
