Solar Orbit Gold Cone's Real Target

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS Pioneer IV blazed a new U.S. space trail today more than a quarter of the way to the moon and farther out than any previous American rocket. Scientists expressed assurance that the gold plated cone would

speed on past the moon into orbit around the sun where the sians claim already to have put their Mechta satellite. The Army blasted of the new Pioneer from Cape Canaveral, Fis shortly after midnight. The launching itself was decribed "as near perfect as could be determined." Initial speed was quickly figured at 24,890 miles an hour, enough to escape the Earth's gravitational pull. By 8 a.m. scientists at the National Aeronautics and Space Agency figured the rocket was 66,000 miles out, more than a fourth of the distance of about 220,000 miles to the moon. 



Voters approved a 2½ mill increase in the tax rate to 28½ mills on the 1988 grand list at the adjourned annual Town Meeting held at the Wapping Elementary School Monday night.

The hercrase is a mill less than at first anticipated, when it was found that a payment on the principal of school bonds will not fall due until the next facel year. A varied list of other items were also considered at the meeting.

The tax was levied to cover total appropriations during the past year of \$902,486.52. Of this total, \$549,488 is for schools and educational services and \$278,227.10 is charged to general government expenses. Other major items were \$24,000 for a new fire truck; \$3,500 for building inapector's assistants; \$6,000 for a superintendent of roads; \$4,000 for replacement and maintenance of town equipment; and \$7,300 for resident relief. Tax rebates to tale \$12,318,92.

Estimated indirect revenues were \$178,397.52. A 28½ mill tax on the \$23,803,380 grand list will raise \$735,396.33, leaving a reserve for uncollected taxes of \$11.
