The Goldstone action followed the probe's path from 6:47 a. m. until 4:04 p. m. yesterday when Pioneer IV dipped below the horizon because of the Earth's rotation causing a 15-hour communication gap.

There still was no estimate from NASA on just what type of orbit it expects Pioneer IV to assume around the sun, which is nearly 93 million miles from Earth.

However, some fairly definite picture is expected before the probe's 11th battery-operated transmitter goes dead, probably some time late Saturday.

Although Pioneer IV appeared to be a spectacular success, it still fell short of the trail blazing accomplishment the Russians claim in 1958.



C of C Asked to Help Form Industrial Unit

The Town Development Commission will ask a Chamber of Commerce committee to help in setting up an industrial foundation in Manchester—a project it hopes to get underway by the end of April.

The decision was made at a TDC meeting in the Municipal Building last night after Chairman Leonard Seader said he felt the time has come to begin seeking support from various town groups for the founding of the privately operated foundation.

Seader suggested that the first and most logical group to ask to participate was the Chamber's industrial development committee, since the aims of that group are primarily the same to attract new industry to town or aid in the expansion of already established firms.

The commission members agreed to invite the committee to a joint meeting within the next two weeks to discuss the proposal and to explain the workings of an industrial foundation in detail.

For several months the commission has been conducting an exhaustive study of such foundations. Information was supplied first by Economic Development Associates, consulting firm in New York City, and then from the State Development Commission, and finally from several towns where foundations have already been established.

To Visit Keat

Members of the commission are scheduled to make a trip to Keat tonight for a continuation of these efforts.

Both the consulting firm and the State Development Commission had expressed their interest in establishing a foundation in Manchester which would be a link to the town in attracting new industry there.

As it is, they said, other towns with such organizations have a distinct advantage over Manchester in the battle for industry.

Purpose of the foundation would be to provide funds at low interest rates, or lands and buildings on a lease or lease-buy basis as an encouragement to industries to move to Manchester. The foundation could also provide financial assistance to local firms for expansion purposes.

According to a State Development Commission spokesman, even top-grade companies now seek the services of industrial development committees which are prepared to offer them other definite aids of buildings. A foundation using funds raised either through contributions or sale of stock could acquire such a site and then lease it to a company, he said.

At last night's meeting Seader emphasized the importance of having the foundation operated by interested groups of citizens in the town. Industry prefers to deal with non-political organizations, he said.

Some Would Take Part

The Town Development Commission would not operate the foundation, but could act in an advisory capacity and some of the members could participate as private individuals, he said.

Columbia Rec Council Gives Report

Annual reports of the 13-year-old Columbia Recreation Council show that the past year's activities have been the continuation of some established programs on an expanded basis—baseball, swimming, and tennis.

Some programs have been curtailed—social dancing classes for lack of facilities, even though Windham High School offered the use of the pool and gym on a "when available" basis. The car club and art classes were dropped for lack of interest and the physical fitness classes for women for lack of an instructor. Teenage country dances were added, and were well attended. The annual Halloween party was held with the help of the teaching staff of the H. W. Porter School. Dr. Ralph W. Volmer, chairman of the program committee, said the number of children participating in one or more Council activities rose from 272 in 1957 to 5,137 compared to the previous year.


