





Trenton, Ga., March 9 (49) — A one-shot showdown with peace of-ficers brought death to an Alabama convict at the end of one of

the largest manhunts ever centered in the tri-state area of Ala-

bama, Georgia and Tennessee.

Desperado William Smothers,
38, died in surgery at nearby Ft.
Oglethorpe Hospital Saturday
night a few hours after the police
chief of this Northwest Georgia
mountain city sent a bullet into his
shoulder.

The chief, H. H. Hutchings, and Sheriff Allison Blevens, got on the convict's trail through a telephoned tip. They found him in a field near U.S. 11 in the Wildwood community, just south of the Ten-

nessee line and about 20 miles southwest of Chattanooga. "Smothers drew a gun from un-

der his coat... and stuck it in the sheriff's face," Hutchings said. "I beat him to it, Before he

could pull the trigger, I shot him. I already had my hand on my

I already had my hand on my gun," he said.

The single shot climaxed a hunt that began Thursday after Smothers, who was serving six robbery sentences, launched his bid for freedom near Birmingham.

The desperado overpowered Alabama Highway Patrolman Otto Dees who was taking him from Kilby Prison at Montgomery to Birmingham to stand trial on a pistol possession charge.

Smothers then forced Dees and the driver of the patrol car, convict trusty Ted Easley, to go to a nearby house he picked at random. There he made the occupants, Mr. and Mrs. Noel Keith, provide food. After that he switched to the Keith's car and took the four persons with him as hostages.
