Washington, March 11 (A)-President Eisenhower confronted Premier Nikita Khrushchev today with the grim prospect that if he starts shooting over Berlin he will have nuclear war on his hands. At a news conference Eisenhower talked with unusual duntness about the kind of conflict which could develop in

a matter of months if the Berlin crisis is carried to the point of armed clash. He apparently was prompted to do so by Democratic attacks in Congress on his defense policies and specifically on the size of U.S. ground forces under those policies. Implicit in these criticisms has been the idea that if there was shooting over Berlin it would be initially a conflict between ground forces and that this might lead to a limited
