Better State Air Service Demanded at CAB Hearing

Washington, March 11 (AP)—Congressional and municipal officials today pressed at a Civil Aeronautics Board hearing for more air transportation in their state.

The hearing was part of a CAB Northeastern State NEA investigation into the need for more local air carrier service.

Demostrate Reps. Donald J. Irwin and Frank Kowalski urged the board to suffer through Connecticut cities to be denied the benefits of air transportation by subjecting them to the distant and deteriorating air service being brought into the area by granting the application of Allegheny, which offers a promise of adequate air service.

Irwin also asked the CAB to consider seriously a proposal to authorize scheduled air service to Danbury, Conn. That city, he said, is on the threshold of a new and dynamic growth and should not be striven in its progress by the lack of good, scheduled air service.

Revolt Course Changed

UAR, Iraq Rift Grows Wider

(Continued from Page One) had regained control of Mosul yesterday. It said the military governor of Iraq had declared a curfew on the northern city.

The Baghdad station had announced Monday that the revolt was smashed within hours and that Shawa had been slain by his own men. The rebel radio at first denied the report, then was heard to say it was true after Monday midnight.

The Middle East News Agency said travelers returning from the Middle East said they had seen Shawa's severed head hanging from a pole in the city of Mosul.

One informant said rebel remnants were still fighting loyalist troops, presumably trying to battle their way to Syria.

The insurgents were believed heading along a highway running northwest from Mosul to Tel Hutech on the Syrian frontier 75 miles away. This would take them to the vicinity of Hamoudya.

AP correspondent Stan Carter, first American newsmen to reach Baghdad after the revolt, said every indication in the capital tended to confirm the government's claim that it controlled the entire country.

Carter reported that Iraq's Communist press was branding the revolt a plot by Nasser. But he said the crowds in the streets still resembled a holiday air and there appeared to be no public antagonism to the government.

Nasser's news agency, quoting a civilian it said had arrived in Syria yesterday from Mosul, reported Nasser had ordered the execution without trial of all officers and civilians who supported the revolt. The report said 60 officers and a number of civilians had been shot. There was no confirmation from any other source.

Bus Kills 2 In Pittsburgh

Pittsburgh, March 11 (AP)—A bustling intersection in downtown Pittsburgh suddenly became a scene of horror yesterday as a commuter bus jumped a sidewalk and plowed into a crowd during the evening rush hour.

Two persons were killed and 16 were injured, four seriously.

The Brentwood Motor Coach Co. bus was approaching a knot of waiting passengers at Smithfield Street and Forbes Avenue when it veered out of control. The driver said later that his air brakes failed.

The bus climbed the curb, cut down a fire alarm pole and a street light then tore into the crowd and nosed against a plate glass display window of Kaufmann's department store.

Three of the screaming victims were flung through windows, several others were trapped under the bus.

One of those killed was Sam Hood, 40, a reporter and art critic from the Pittsburgh Press. He was walking back to his office after interviewing the president of the American Bar Assn., Room 1, Mellon St.

Also killed was Mrs. Sally Flynn Stral, 54, of nearby Baldwin. She was cash cashier at the Roosevelt Hotel.

The crash stunned bystanders. Some hugged at the bus to free those trapped beneath. Others used umbrellas and hard coats to try to bind the cuts of the victims.

Ambulances were rushed from all parts of the city. Hundreds of gaping spectators milled about. Traffic was snarled on busy Smithfield Street. The victims were rushed to three hospitals.

The stunned bus driver, Jay Lane, was treated for minor injuries then taken to Central Police Station for questioning.

"There was a street car in front of me," he told detectives. "The street car pulled out. Thirty feet from where I was to stop I applied my brakes. I was going very slow.

"When I put my foot on the brake it went clear to the floor. I pulled into the curb and tried to grab the bus along the curb and bring it to a stop. The bus jumped the curb and I aimed for the pole."

Lane was released on a \$10,000 bond pending an inquest on a technical charge of manslaughter.

Lane was so distraught he was re-admitted to a hospital shortly after midnight suffering shock. Ten other injured were detained in three hospitals.

Detective Bernard Milligan said a check of the bus after the crash showed only the hand brake working. The bus was impounded for closer examination.

Communism. In reality, this use of the Berlin crisis for their own political headlines is not much more than a ruse to draw attention to their own power politics.

Under the particular order by which Washington now operates its chiefs of staff are more or less compelled to testify formally, that they are satisfied with the armed service budget allocations approved by the President and the secretary of defense.

Congress has now finally obtained from the chiefs of the Navy, Air Force and Marines, such statements of their individual views on the budget that all previously approved in their formal appearances on the budget.

This natural behavior, on the part of the armed services chiefs, is now being taken by the Democrats in Congress and coupled with the atmosphere of crisis over Berlin, in order to launch a full scale attack on the President.

He is accused of pinching pennies while our national survival is at stake, and weakening our military position in the world at the very moment when we should stand strongest, of caring more about balancing the budget than about facing up to Communist conspiracy.

The President himself has felt forced to make a similar claim for his own military expenses. But the President does not need to be a military expert himself in order to counter the Democratic strategy on this issue.

The second fact the Democrats choose to ignore is that, should the Berlin crisis result in war, even their own most generous proposals for military spending would be puny and academic compared to the reality that would then have to take over.

The Democrats then are out to exploit, without pretending to answer or cure, the tension and danger they see in the Berlin crisis. These particular ways of attacking our new world, with space pirates pinning attacks, Eisenhower as a pincer of pennies and prodding our military strategy, are the only ways that the only real resters of

the Berlin crisis, for their own more scrupulous than Kluge's use of it in his own power politics strategies. They would have us think that they alone can defend us. They also have the comfort of knowing that they will not and cannot be given the actual responsibility for defending us. Let the President continue to concern himself with the Russians. He will, we think, take care of himself.

Iron Fox Frustrated. The virtues, or the sins, of West Germany's Chancellor Adenauer are not likely to be assessed dispassionately in this country, or perhaps on his own either, until the temper and circumstances of the times permit him to be measured for something besides his anti-Communism. 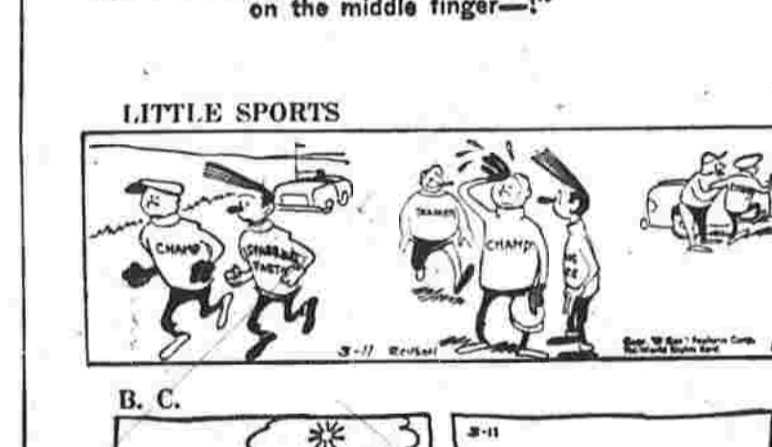
