

Pittsburgh, March 11 (P)—A bustling intersection in downtown Pittsburgh suddenly became a scene of horror yesterday as a commuter bus jumped a sidewalk and plowed into a crowd during the evening rush hour. Two persons were killed and 16 were injured, four seriously.

The Brentwood Motor Coach Co. bus was approaching a knot of waiting passengers at Smithfield Street and Forbes Avenue when it veered out of control. The driver said later that his air brakes fail-The bus climbed the curb, cut down a fire alarm pole and a

street light then tore into the crowd and nosed against a plate glass display window of Kaufmann's department store. Three of the screaming victims were flung through the window. Several others were trapped under the bus. One of those killed was Sam Hood, 40, a reporter and art critic for the Pittsburgh Press. He was walking back to his office after in-
