





First Voodoo Squadron Assigned to Otis AFB

THURSDAY, MARCH 19, 1959

The supersonic F-101B Voodoo fighter-interceptor, powered by two Pratt & Whitney Aircraft J57 engines, is the latest addition to the complex machinery guarding the Atlantic Coast of the United States.

Twelve of these 2-man, longrange, all-weather fighters were unveiled to the public at Otis Air Force Base on Cape Cod yesterday. They are replacing older craft of the 60th Fighter-Interceptor Squadron at Otis and make up the first Voodoo Squadron in the nation.

The Voodoo enters the Air Defense Command complex which begins with distant early warning (DEW line) radar stations and includes other radar defenses (such as the off-shore "Texas Towers"), fighter and interceptor squadrons, Bomarc missile groups and the network of Nike installations surrounding large industrial areas.

The roughly 300 air and ground crewmen of the 60th FIS have spent an average of 20 hours with the new jets. They are proud to
