## Cautions on Trying Bluff or Blackmail

Washington, March 25 (AP)-President Eisenhower indiectly warned Soviet Premier Khrushchet today against trying to force a summit meeting through bluff or blackmail. But said that in seeking real settlements Khrushchev is the man to negotiate with.

Eisenhower said he believes the western Allies will have meet at the summit with Khrushchev to get any sort of valid agreement on German problems. But no one is going to command the United States and the other western powers to show up at a top level conference, he President told a news conference emphatically. The Allies will not be bluffed or blackmailed into going to
