Argument BY FRANK BRUTTO Vatican City, April 8 (AP)-The commander of the Pope's Swiss Guards, Col. Robert Nunlist, was shot and wounded today by a disgruntled former guardsman. The ex-guardsman, Adolf Rucker, was wounded when the commander sought to disarm him. "An ex-Swiss Guard fired two pistol shots at the commander of the corps, wounding him, but not seriously," the Guards headquar-"The ex-Swiss Guard had insisted on being re-enlisted into service after having been expelled last year because of epileptic sympoms caused by a cranial trauma." There were varying accounts as to whether the former guardsman

shot himself or was wounded accidently in a scuffie. Nunlist and his son August, 19. had just finished lunch when word came that Rucker wanted to see he colonel. The colonel went to a Vatican courtyard. August Nunlist heard two shots. then a pause and two more. He ran out and found his father wreatling due the ex-Guardsman. 

Daley, in winning a second 4-year term, polled a near record vote ma-jority for a mayoral election. He more than 465,000 votes. getting 71.36 per cent of the total ballot and out-voting Sheehan by Daley, a veteran in politics and backed by one of the country's most powerful Democratic organizations, made the best showing in a mayoral election since 1935. 





nite atomic structure as do othe

elements with which it may com-bine to form compounds. For example, one atom of fluorine w combine with one atom of the ele-ment sodium to form one molecule of sodium fluoride. Sodium fluoride ilssolved in water dissociates in sodium ions and fluoride ions. Flu oride ions in a public water system are the same and they behave in the same way whether the fluori dissolved from mineral deposits or added under good chemical and engineering control in a water treatment plant.

The terms "artificial" or "chemical" are used sometimes in a misleading sense and cause confusion and misunderstanding in reference to the use of prepared or water. Chemists do not manufa ture fluorine or fluorides from other elements. They use naturally occurring minerals from which to prepare and refine the fluoride compounds that are available commercially.
Fluorine is one of the naturally occurring elements found in min eral form as fluorides in various localities. The earth's crust, inch ing rocks, soil, water and vegeta-tion is composed of many differ-ent minerals in widely varying quantities. The element fluorine is found in most lake, river and well water as fluoride ions. It comes to
