### Statement On Fluoridation By Leading American Authorities

Fluoridation was subjected to the most comprehensive field trials ever devoted to a public health advance, and as a result of these studies the following conclusions were reached.

(1) The adjustment of the fluoride content of public water supplies to a level of one part fluoride to one million parts of water results in an effective means of protecting children against dental decay.

(2) This protection lasts through life, with the expectancy that a person drinking fluoridated water through his life time will have about one-third the amount of dental decay as would a person drinking non-fluoridated water.

(3) The safety of the procedure has been established.

(4) It is the conclusion of the undersigned that the delay in water fluoridation on the part of a community as a result of fear or harm to the population is completely and utterly unjustified, and that the fluoridation of public water supplies is a safe public health measure whose benefits should be made available to as many people as possible as soon as possible.
