Boatwright Subtle, Lyric As Recitalist

By PHILIP TREGGOR As the final event in the cur rent season of Civic Music Concerts, McHenry Boatwright, baritone, was presented last night in the high school auditorium.

Mr. Boatwright brought the Manchester audience a program which showed, for the most part, which showed, for the most part, impeccable taste. It was extremely well balanced and offered an exciting variety ranging from early Italian, through German lied to contemporary song. Many styles were apparent in the choice of operatic, comic, love and sacred music: music: Endowed with a handsome, full

voice Mr. Boatwright does not abuse this fact by running under-a full head of steam all evening. He knows how, when and where to let down to lyricism.

First and last he is a recitalist. This means he sings with subtlety olor, nuance and imagination. Unlike many others, he is not conte to simply display his rich baritons one long, continuous outpouring, His approach is thoroughl musicianly, except that he is prone to take the greatest liberties with

the rhythmic structure of a song.
Someti.nes Overdone
His rendition of Verdi's famous aria "Eri tu" was, in fact, so subtle that if he were to sing it the same way in an opera house, he wouldn't last the week. While his program did not have that dreadful sameness of speed and volume that so many more famous singers offer, there is a danger he must avoid it is of trying too hard to be subtle. The result is sometimes overdone. His approach singing is strictly on the bor derline between that which is true art and that which is sham. Tueswere most a fully done in the first half of hy program. How-ever, right after intermission things began to get a little heavy-handed and culminated in the corniest version of Old Man River that I have ever endured. Incidentally this was his own arrangement in which he played his own accompaniment and which he ofered as ah el.core.

Mr. Boatwright has a great deal of potential as a recitalist and he has all ady made a fir impression as a singer both here and abroad. He is still young as rtists go, and t will be interest ng to see what direction his work will take as he matures. Reginald Boardman provided the plane accompaniment for the program most capably. The ensemble between pianist and singer was good in spite of Mr. Boat wright's rhythmic eccentricities.
