Underground Test Could Be Muffled, U.S. Informs Soviet

Washington, June 12 (AP)—The United States today handed Russia a White House scientific report saying it would probably be able to muffle underground nuclear tests. The report says that it would take three years to develop underground atomic blasts as good as those that Geneva test negotiators had believed were possible, according to information from an underground source. The U.S. officials said, however, that the findings by the scientists under Dr. Lloyd Berkner do not indicate that the U.S. has a control system in place to enforce the ban.

38 Hurt in Elevated Station Mad Bomber Hunted After Blast in Boston

Boston, June 12 (AP)—Police today hunted a mad bomber in the wake of an explosion which shattered a rapid transit train station 20 feet above a busy Boston intersection yesterday. Thirty-eight persons were injured, three seriously, in the blast which investigators said was caused by a home-made bomb planted in a public coin locker. High police officials said the bombing apparently was the work of a fanatic bent on destruction.

Erhard Claims Pledge Broken, U.S. Informs Soviet

Bonn, Germany, June 12 (AP)—Ludwig Erhard told parliament today that when he left for the United States on June 1, he was convinced Chancellor Konrad Adenauer would keep his promise to run for president. This was a direct contradiction of Adenauer's declaration in the Bundestag yesterday that he had given Erhard notice of his intention to remain as chancellor after his term in office ended in September. Erhard is a member of the Christian Democratic Union, the largest of the parties in the Bundestag.

Walkout Over for Firestone

Cleveland, June 12 (AP)—The United Rubber Workers and Firestone Tire & Rubber Co. today signed agreements to end a 58-day-old strike of 18,000 employees in eight cities. The Firestone strike was the longest and most costly in the history of the United Rubber Workers. The strike began on April 15 when the union voted to walk out over a proposed contract that would have reduced wages and benefits.

Gromyko Tries to Cut Geneva-Summit Link

the excitement is about. He urged the waters to stop using the ultimatum and demand.

But he coupled this statement with the fact that the Geneva summit had been a failure. He said the summit was a failure because the Soviet side had refused to give an ultimatum. He said the ultimatum was a threat that had been removed. This, he said, made it possible to have further meetings, "but not on the basis of the Soviet proposal."

As to the question of a summit meeting, Gromyko said nothing had happened since Eisenhower told the news conference nine days ago that he found no progress at Geneva.

"You can even say the conference has gone backwards," Gromyko said. "Since the Soviet proposal in Berlin one year (deadline plan), there is less likelihood than there is now."

It was this point which gave extraordinary significance to Gromyko's attack on the link between the foreign ministers meeting and a heads of government meeting.

In the most extended discussion of the summit subject to date in the conference, Gromyko said that any state which puts artificial obstacles in the way of a summit conference "will be responsible for the consequences."

He opened his attack by saying some western representatives have been talking about how a summit here would mean no summit conference.

"The Soviet government considers that the summit conference should not be made the subject of bargaining," Gromyko said. "It is a summit conference as such which should be held, not a summit conference as a bargaining tool."

He said he considered that one such meeting, a number of such meetings, could successfully mark a turning point for better international relations.

"And if the western powers display their readiness to seek solutions on outstanding questions such solutions can be reached."

"If there is any connection between the Geneva conference of foreign ministers and a summit conference this connection can be explained only in such a way that no obstacles should be laid down on the road toward the conference of the heads of government."

Gromyko said that the Soviet representative has stated that the Soviet Union seeks and is desirous to reach agreement at the present conference, but to put any artificial obstacle on the road to the summit conference means to assume grave responsibility. Should any state put up such obstacles to a summit meeting, that state will take responsibility for the consequences.

Gromyko's foreign minister spoke at a semi-private meeting in the Palace of Nations after Harter called on him to state for the record what he had told Harter in a secret session yesterday.

Harter and his western colleagues, who have delayed the conference by a day-to-day battle now, carried their onslaught against Soviet proposals for a summit in the Berlin settlement through the final 3-hour session of the fifth week.

They have threatened to break off next week unless the Russians pull a diplomatic retreat over the weekend.

Agreement was reached for a secret session Monday.

How many inspections would be needed in a year is a key point both to the Russians—who say they object to foreign inspectors on their soil—and to the Americans, who say enforcement is impossible without inspections.

A summary of the panel's findings said the panel believed that the proposed research program would make possible in three years detection systems as effective as the Geneva research program which it believed their proposed 180 station worldwide program would equal.

The U.S. scientists added:

"In considering the possibility of the capability now or in the future of the Geneva system might be reduced by the international concealment of underground tests, the panel concluded that detecting techniques exist which would reduce the seismic (earth wave) signal by a factor of 10 or more. (The seismic signal is a principal means of detecting underground tests.)"

"Moreover, the report continued, 'the panel believes that the Geneva system is not a simple matter of having shown that it is possible in principle to reduce the seismic signal from an explosion by a much greater factor than this.'

Scientists explained that concealing a nuclear test by concealing a weak test. Decoupling is achieved by the use of a heavily layered structure of rock which roughly translated, means the seismic signal that would be caused by an atomic blast.



