The 207 Rockville High School graduates exchanged most exclamations with parents, friends, classmates, teachers, and even strangers, after commencement exercises at the school last night.

More than 900 guests were seated in the gymnasium on folding chairs and bleachers, while about a dozen persons without tickets heard the ceremonies over a loud speaker in the auditorium.

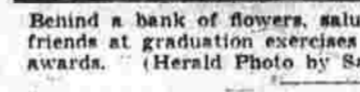

My Fair Gentleman (Britain's TV Kid)

By HOPE LAWDER RITCHIE

When the American press saluted the boy from Britain as an "overnight success," the 30-year-old British star grinned wryly. "Twins a hell of a long night!" In a soft voice, edged with Londonness (or is it a near-Welsh accent?) Dave King added emphatically: "Fifteen years!"

During a rehearsal break for "Music Theatre" (NBC-TV, Wednesdays, 10-11 EDT), dressed in dungarees and munching on a store-made sandwich, Dave told us a bit about the past 15 years and his beginning in England.

"In a sense, I've been preparing

for America since I was 12 years old and fell in love with cowboys and Indians and football. When we moved from Twickenham into East London, my mother was working and sent me off to register on my own in school. British laws at that time required me to go to school until I was 14. I danced over to the authorities, told them I was 14 years old. For some reason, they believed me and never checked up at home. So I shuffled-off to Buffalo, worked at every kind of job and began to spend all the spare time I could at the cinema. I guess because Indians were so far away, grass is always greener. I began to study them and read books on Indian lore. It is my greatest hobby - and that of collecting model railroad trains.

Likes to Make Bread

"I had about a job a week - was a fruit and vegetable hawker, a baker at the circus. My favorite? Working in a bakery. I had a bit of a dry sandwich. "At first, I cleaned the long baking tins, but soon was promoted to making dough and baking the loaves of bread. I loved the smell of it, and still do. In fact, I still make bread at home.

"During all those years" - he made an impish grin - "I was a real little ham - loving to mimic people, to dance and act. I had dreams of being a musician, but all I could do was to be a drummer. Because I could make people laugh and sing, I got into my first traveling group in a Music Hall circuit at fifteen."

The 5' 8", 11 stone (multiply by 14 for pounds) colorful Dave King brings with him to America a brilliant reputation as England's top-rated TV comedian and recording star, an accolade gained in 1954 following his first appearance on BBC's TV "Music Hall." The titles "Music Hall" have brought him luck, he says. He,

however, has brought to them a variety of talents - an expert pantomimist, a skilled dancer, a voice which gives the women goose-flesh, and an extraordinary charm. He has no capacity for boredom. The impish mischief, often well-hidden behind a calm manner, is deep-rooted, and is the spring-board for many of his improvisations.

Praises Writers

Dave is generous in his praise for those who work with him, and the two British writers who have been with him since his first television show are with him here. He brought them over to sit in on the interview. Sid C. Green and Dick M. Hills, "the boys who double in brass and work themselves into the act," said Dave.

Dick Hills, deadpan, stated: "You see, we don't write our scripts."

Sid C. Green poked his glasses up on his nose: "We act 'em out."

Dick: "Along about a day before dress rehearsal, in England this is, when we've been in the act with Dave, the director 'll say: Who's booked for these two wazy roles?"

Sid: "Nobody's been booked for 'em, so we always have to help out and act 'em."

Dave: "They work their way in to the acts, get paid two ways,

and I have to keep my eye on 'em, or someday I'll find they have my job."

The dialogue ended with some kidding and turned to audience reactions.

Likes Enthusiasm

"How do American audiences differ from British?" I asked.

"My spirited interviewee answered enthusiastically. "Here in America, the audiences troop into the studio with a 'Let's have fun attitude. We're ready. Let's go! Britishers sit on their hands and say: 'Alright, if you're so good, show us!'"

The writers agreed that a star had to work much harder before an English audience.

"Incidentally," said Dave seriously, "All this talk about me being so calm is so much nonsense. I'm scared stiff half the time. When I was invited to be on the Perry Como Show, which introduced me to America, I had a big dose of stage fright." He shook his head as if still amazed at himself. "I never dreamed the audiences would be so good to me. I had already been signed for the Kraft Music Hall replacement, but it all seemed unreal for a 'hile."

Dave hasn't had much time to travel about America, but he and his writers went to the coast to see the Brazil vs. U.S.A. football game. Next trip he takes, he wants to go to visit some Indian tribes. "My daughters are named after them: Cheyenne is two, and Kiowa is one." His family is living in Surrey, and he doesn't think he'll bring them over here this trip. "They wouldn't like the heat," he said. He is married to a former dancer, Jean Hart.

"We live very simply," claimed Dave. "In between TV shows and recording sessions (he is under contract with Decca in Great Britain and London label in America) we enjoy fishing, water skiing, and I'm apt to go about collecting model trains. By the way, I have a replica of Grand Central Station and a miniature electric train titled 'Dave King Special' given me by the members of my show."

Big Following

Rehearsal break was over. Vic Schoen, musical director of "Music Hall," lifted his baton. Chorus

girls piqueted on stage. The producer, Nick Vanoff, came by to tell Dave that a large group of Canadians were attending the show that night. Dave's face lit up: "Good." Then he turned to me: "We have had groups of Scottish and British join us, and it still amazes us the amount of fan mail we are getting from them. And the Americans seem to have taken to us, too!"

And indeed, the American viewers have. The spirited personality of a mischievous comedian who is aware that he doesn't have to stuff the gags down our throats is as delightful to the home audience of all ages as is the Perry Como who introduced him to us on April 6th. His special brand of humor will keep us gay on Wednesday evenings all summer, and maybe he'll be back next year...
