London, July 6 (A)-The Soviet Union has launched a space rocket containing two dogs which were returned safely to Earth, Moscow radio said tonight.

The announcement came from Tass, the Soviet News Agency.

Moscow said the launching was made July 2.
It described the event as a routine launching of a single stage geo-physical ballistic rocket of medium

Previously the United States had recovered two monkeys sent into space. One of these died later.
The first animal of note to be projected into space was the Rus-sian dog Laika, which died. Mission of the rocket was to aid scientific research in "the upper layers of the atmosphere," the

It did not immediately say if the rocket was put into orbit around the Earth or stretched farther into space. There was no immediate in-dication how high the dogs flew. Moscow said the rocket was
