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**President Vetoes Omnibus Housing Bill as Too Costly**

Washington, July 7 (AP)—President Eisenhower today vetoed the omnibus housing bill, calling it "an important and inflationary. He asked that Congress produce a less costly measure."

The 10-page bill, which would authorize \$2.3 billion for housing construction in fiscal 1960, is the largest housing bill since the late 1940s. It would authorize the construction of 1,000,000 new housing units, including 500,000 for low-income families.

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**Prison Guard Rescues 38 Held Captive by 4 Convicts**

Monroe, Wash., July 7 (AP)—Thirty-eight hostages held for 13 1/2 hours in a terror-filled battle by four "kill crazy" young convicts were freed without harm at the State Reformatory today in a surprise rear gas attack.

Armed officers carried out the rescue at 4:03 a.m. (PST) two hours before the third and latest deadline set by the revolting prisoners. Reformatory officials said it went "like clockwork."

The rebels, who had armed themselves with butcher knives and long forks in the kitchen yesterday afternoon in the abortive escape attempt, threatened violence only to the three guards held hostage.

One of the guards, Hugh DeWalt, said after the rescue that the desperadoes had told the officers to start praying because they would be thrown out of the window dead if their demands for freedom were not met.

Twenty-five visitors, many of them women and children, and 11 other prisoners who had been visiting relatives were mixed along with the convicts. One woman was released from the barricaded visitors' room during the escape attempt.

The 38 hostages included three guards and the 11 convicts were freed after a 13 1/2-hour battle.

The dead woman's husband, Robert, 34, was taken to a hospital where he is being treated for injuries. Mrs. DeWalt was taken to a hospital where she is being treated for injuries.

The four were ordered placed in isolation and state officials said they would be turned over to the courts.

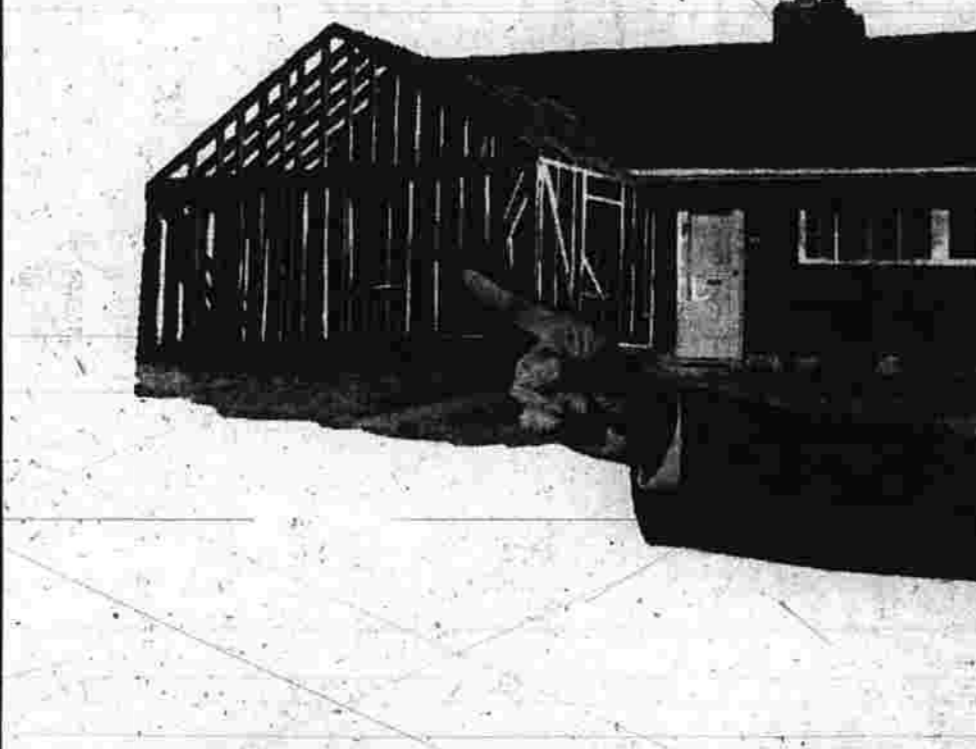

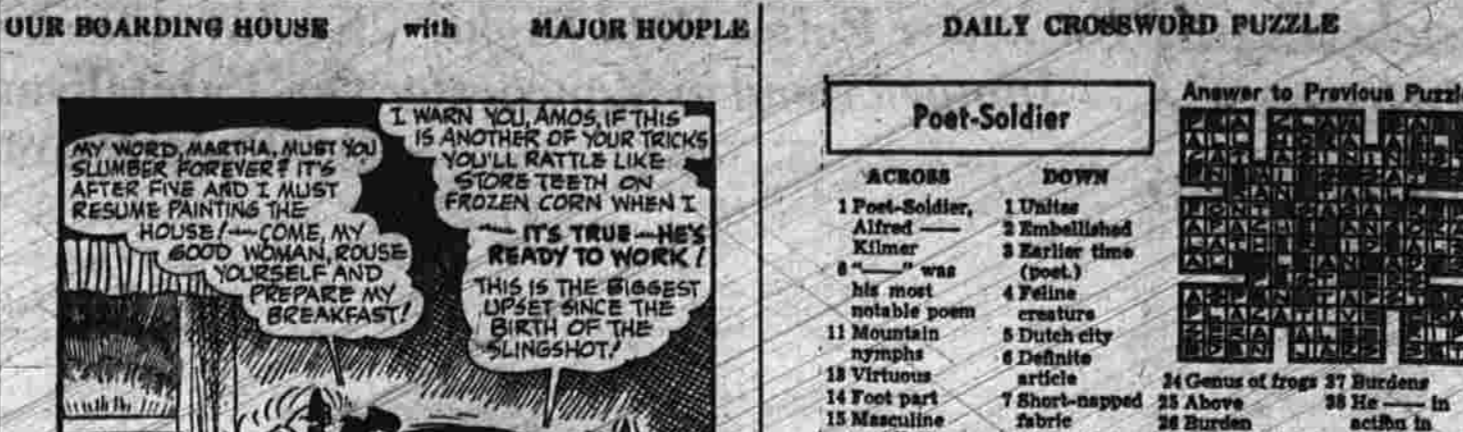

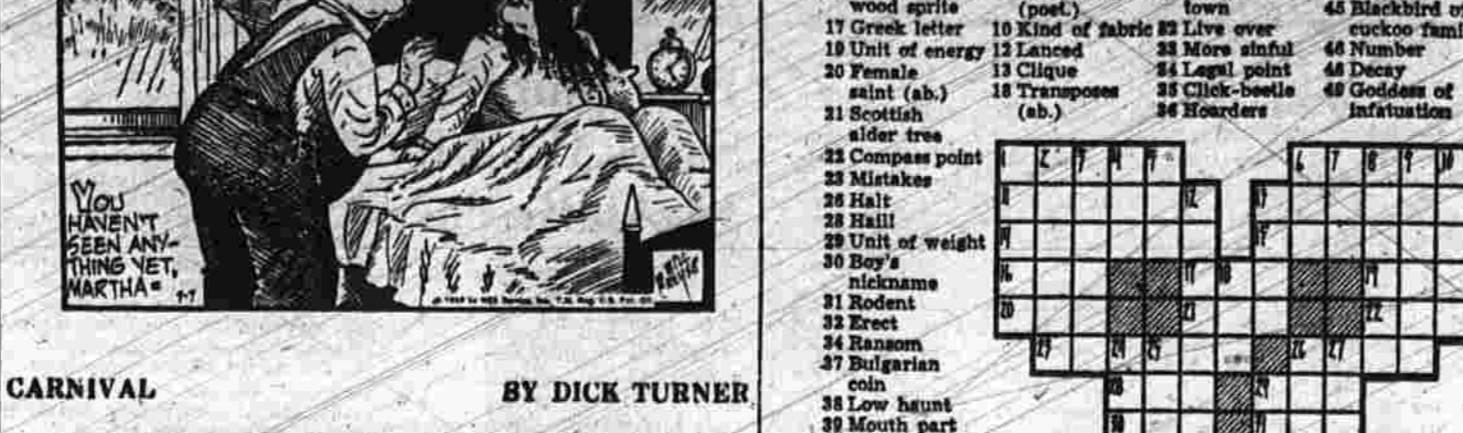
