Since the war, four major first aid techniques—control of bleeding, artificial respiration, cold injuries and transportation methods—have been revered. What was formerly the thing to do is now the dangerous thing to do.





Why I'm

Editors' Note

This may seem like the most scurrilous, outrageous attack on suburban living you have ever read. But we couldn't help laughing, and we hope you'll laugh too. We theroughly disagree with the author of I Can Get It For You Wholesale, The Enemy Camp and countless other best-cellers but, like Voltairs, we are ready to defend to the death his "right to say it"—especially as we've engaged another best-celling author, Peter De Vries, to reply to him in our August lasse.

A FTER a dozen years as a commuter I am leaving the suburbs. My reason? The same reason that caused Edmond Dantes to leave his dungeon in the Chateau D'If and return to Paris: I have finished serving my sentence.

The fact that my incarceration was self-imposed made it no less onerous than the imprisonment to which the hero of *The Count Of Monte Cristo* was subjected by his implacable enemies. I did not realize, of course, when I forsook the city pavements on which I had been born, raised, educated, married, and inducted into parenthood, that I was turning my back on all the things that make life worth living. On the contrary.

I thought I was embarking on a way of life that would be to my previous existence what the Kohinoor is to the rhinestone. My horizons, I was told, like those of Columbus when he set his course due west, were about to be enlarged beyond recognition. Life, which I was told in my teens began at forty, I was told in my thirties began in suburbia.

What nobody told me is that it never gets very far beyond that beginning. Applying the word living to existence in the suburbs is like applying the word chilly to the Arctic Circle. It's true enough, but it hardly tells the whole story.

My story, like that of most suburbanites, begins with parenthood. Until that hit me, I seem to recall that I was a creature of average intelligence and

reasonable courage. As soon as I became a father, I became as well a fool and a coward. Instead of paying attention to the evidence of my own experience, which indicated clearly that it was possible to enjoy as I had a healthy and happy childhood in the city, I listened worriedly and guiltily to the child guidance counselors, a surprisingly noisy crew. They insisted that any parent who could afford to, but did not provide, his offspring during the years of growth with the benefits of country life, deserved to be shot and, when his resentful children reached the trigger-pulling age, probably would be.

Like most fools and cowards, I sought and of course found reasons to demonstrate to my own satisfaction that my foolishness was wisdom and my cowardice bravery. It wasn't only for the children that I was moving to the suburbs. Oh, no. Look what it would do for me and my wife as well. After a dozen years of looking, a number of things began to come into focus. They all added up to reasons for going back where I came from.

THE most important reason, of course, is that whatever advantages suburbia may have for the growing child, or for the parent of the growing child, become disadvantages when the child grows up. Our children were infants when we brought them to the country. They could not fight back. They are now twelve years older. I can no longer get away with

telling them, for example, that our local baseball games are as exciting as anything that takes place in the Yankee Stadium. They have reached the age of reason. They know better. They want to go to the Yankee Stadium. As a matter of strict accuracy, so do I, but that's a minor point.

The main point is that for the last few years the amount of time I have been able to devote to earning a living is a mere fraction of the time I have been forced to devote to driving back and forth between our home in the suburbs and the Yankee Stad ium; the American Museum of Natural History (like any city museum, it is bigger and better than our local suburban museums); Radio City Music Hall (like any city movie theatre, it is bigger and better than etc.); Madison Square Garden (like any city sports arena, it is etc.); the Bronx Zoo (like any big city zoo, etc.); and a list of other attractions as long as my doleful countenance, all of which are available only in the city, and all of which my children (who I was told a dozen years ago wanted nothing from life but fresh air and sunlight) feel they cannot live

without.

I feel the same way. I have nothing against fresh air and sunlight. I am an average man who likes to live near the things he likes, and the things his children like, and getting to the things we like from where we now live is a quicker road to bankruptcy than anything thought up by Mr. Micawber. The time

wasted in traveling back and forth between suburbia and a decent ball game, or a Broadway play (when you find anything as good as "My Fair Lady" in West Moriches, let me know), is as nothing by comparison with the expense, especially if you are playing host to your own children.

When as a city boy I went to a ball game, or to any other of the many exciting events that the march of civilization has decreed can take place only in a large city, my mother gave me my lunch, subway fare, the price of a bleachers seat, and instructions to get home before dark. When as a suburban father I take my brood to, let us say, a meeting of the UN Council (which they have been told by their suburban school teacher they MUST NOT MISS), I feel as though I were lifting the check for one of Diamond Jim Brady's more elaborate entertainments. Between ten-thirty in the morning when we set out, and ten-thirty at night when—as my suburban neighbors ("cards," every one of them) put it—we return to the stables, the family exchequer—or, as daddy puts it, his bankroll—takes a beating.

Gasoline, highway tolls, parking fees in the city, taxis from the city garage to the place in town we have come to visit, at least two restaurant meals, I don't know how many in-between snacks—it doesn't matter whether we have come in to see "The Music Man" from orchestra seats or take a ride on the Staten Island Ferry, the day's expenses always seem to add up to \$60.00.

There are suburbanites who claim they manage to reduce this figure by leaving the car at home and going into town by train. I claim they either never learned how to add, or they don't know the meaning of the word fear. I do. I learned it as a commuter.

When I first moved to the suburbs, our local railroad was a means of transportation. Today as I write (with a nervously shaking hand) our local railroad has become either a bad joke or a daily invitation to violent death, and I gather from the public prints that the same is true of almost every commuters' railroad in the country: the seats are filthy, the washrooms detestable, the conductors sullen, the fares outrageous, the schedules lies, and the passengers helpless victims of the whole miserable system.

Not all the passengers. Some, like this correspondent, have begun to ask themselves why they are putting up with this.

Certainly not for the social life of suburbia, which is conducted in public and consists of being imbedded like a raisin in a rice pudding in a single set of people who spend their time discussing the outrageous cost of artifacts they purchase and events they attend in the city they have fled. The city with its endless variety of social groups or sets, in any number of which a man can function without his neighbors' staring over his shoulder, provides something that does not exist in suburbia: privacy.

It also provides a lesson in economics: the notion that it is cheaper to live in your own suburban home (yours and the mortgage company's, that is) than in a city apartment is as fiscally sound as the belief that business cycles are caused by sun spots.

They are welcome to mine. As the laborer is worthy of his hire, the teacher is worthy of his fee, and these larcenous yokels, to whom for a dozen years I have been a legitimate prey, have earned a stiff one for reminding me of a basic truth: from the very dawn of time, man's march upward out of the primeval ooze has moved inexorably from the forest to the cave, from the veldt to the settlement, from the prairie to the town.

I did not realize, all those years ago when I bowed to the dictates of the child guidance counselors and cocked an attentive ear to the siren song of the suburban realtor, that I was moving against the current of civilization, that I was embarking on an activity as unnatural to the normal man, and therefore


doomed to failure, as was Icarus when he pasted on those waxen wings.

More and More Marinas

TIME was, when a son was born, his father rushed -and we have this on good authority-the thing to do on the day your son is born is to run right down to the local yacht basin and place his name on the waiting list for a berth for the boat he will one day have. Chances are that there will be adequate facilities for the boating millions by the time your son needs it.

As it is, there are almost three million Americans who want boats of their own this summer, but won't be getting them because there aren't enough moorings to be had. The three million or so who already own sloops, canoes, houseboats, and cabin cruisers are a swamping all available facilities at the choice dockside marvels that line our waterways from coast to coast-the multi-million-dollar marinas.

What Is a Marina?

And what, exactly, is a marina? It is, we are told, a "boat basin with facilities for berthing, securing, and servicing of all types of recreational craft, as

well as providing adequate supplies, provisions, stordefinition, which only hints at the great variety of goods and services available to the weary skipper who puts in at one of them. Today's marina is practically a suburb on its own, laid out and fully equipped to satisfy the least wish of those who like to live affoat.

A complete marina, 1959 version, furnishes not only well-planned slips, launching ramps, winter storage, marine railways, marine repair and supply shops, and auto parking space, but boats for charter, firstaid stations, auto rental service, restaurants, showers, brokerage offices, clubhouses, swimming pools and other recreational facilities, complete shopping center, waterway travel bureaus, and boatels (marine

In addition, from the moment you tie up, here are some of the other features of a marina that are becoming almost commonplace. There are marinas that have classes in sailor's English for that landlubber guest of yours. At some, you need only pick up the and find baby sitters, hairdressers, barbers, tailors, photographers, as well as pick-up boys to handle

If you're hungry, at certain marinas you may have a five-course buffet supper impeccably served aboard the family cruiser by an expert steward, and if you don't like to make up bunks, swab decks, and handle other boat chores, just notify mate service. If you're tired of the galley curtains or want the main cabin done over, the marina's interior decorators and upholsterers will do it. A number of marinas will rebuild your entire boat and repair your sails. And while they are about it, you can check into the boatel, take a dip in the pool, and enjoy "Skipper Steak Deluxe," "Sailorette Salad," and "Nautical Noodles" at the

East Side, West Side Although there are now marinas in every part of the country, the most famous, and most luxurious so far are still around our classic "sun spots."

The first of the big, modern, super-marinas is Bahia Mar, on the Intercoastal Waterways at Fort Lauderdale, Florida. Built in 1949, Bahia Mar is on a man-made island which centers three miles of con-

crete piers, and is a perfect example of how swamp. lands are being reclaimed for marina sites. A visit to Bahia Mar is like a visit to a complete little waterways community. The shopping center is made up of 28 stores, plus a U. S. Weather Recording Station and a branch of the U.S. Post Office. The recreation center has a game area and swimming pool, and the yacht club offers outdoor movies and music for dancing. A fleet of 27 boats is available for charter; seven sight-seeing passenger ships visit nearby points of in-terest daily; and there are water taxis to hail if you're in a hurry. Last year, this 450-boat marina logged in 1,240 yachts.

Some other Florida pleasure-boating centers are particularly interesting because of their colorful history. Flamingo, once the hideaway and escape route for desperados who travelled the alligator-infested mangrove swamps to reach their boats is now the home of a new 200-boat marina and visitor's center. Another interesting spot is Apalachicola. At one time it was a sleepy little fishing town where it was difficult to earn a living. Thanks largely to it's modern marina, it is now a booming resort area for those who like to fish in the Gulf of Mexico and Apalachicola Bay

with its 75 miles of surrounding rivers and lakes.

On the Pacific side there is a whole string of plush marinas that make the California coastline a boatlover's paradise. Redwood City, near San Francisco, is one of the many suburbs taking to the water this year with a marina of it's own. Near Los Angeles is the magnificent \$25 million Marina Playa Del Rey. Partially in operation now, it should be completed in 1960. A bit farther south the state is establishing a series of picturesque boating playgrounds at Alamitos Bay and Redondo Beach. When finished, this project promises to be the largest small-boat anchorage in the world.

California's Newport Beach, once a wasteland, is the site of some twenty present-day marinas. Here, for example, are the popular Balboa Bay Club and the



exclusive Villa Marina. The Villa's patio cottages for permanent and transient guests and other deluxe accommodations and services have kept some guests tied up at dockside for the past twelve years. On a bright night you might see, in the harbor, the yachts of visiting royalty, the cruiser of a South American President, the houseboat of a college professor and, in the section designed for small craft, the dugout canoe of an American Indian.

In the southernmost part of the state one of the country's most impressive city projects-Mission Bay Aquatic Park-is being rushed to completion. A twentyfive-year development, this mammoth \$27,200,000 boat hostel will accommodate 10,000 boat owners. There will be features unusual even to marinas, such

an aquarium, a drive-in water restaurant, and a service station canning the deep-sea fish you catch.


Wherever There's Water What promises to be one of the finest installations in the east is Yacht Haven, situated on three islands just off Stamford, Conn. The project, begun in mid-1957, is unique in that it is the first marina known to offer a public issue of shares of common and preferred stock. Another Eastern boat mecca is Gloucester Gateway on Rust Island, Gloucester, Massachusetts. When complete it will have an amphitheater, an apartment building, and a hotel designed along the lines of the Caribe Hilton. Even Boston now has its first marina, an 800-boat accommodation at the former Squantum Air Base on Boston Harbor.

Naturally, the opening of the St. Law-rence Seaway is inspiring our Great Lakes cities and towns to go full speed ahead into the building of waterway accommodations for pleasure boats. Toledo's Port Authority is hurrying completion of its Seaway Marina on Kelley's Island, Lake Erie; and other facilities are being developed all along the southern shore of the lake to Erie, Pennsylvania, where a 2,500-boat harbor is nearing completion. Cleveland has created public harbor facilities for 700 pleasure craft in the metropolitan area. At Detroit's Roostertails Marina there will soon be an amphitheater for viewing racing events. In the same category is the waterside park and launching facility on Lake Washington, Scattle.

The Marina's Future What is the future of the marina? More than one hundred million dollars will be spent this year throughout the nation to produce housing for pleasure craft, but the money will not even begin to fill the needs of boat-happy Americans. "Sorry, no space," are familiar words to the 1,825,000 who filed applications in their local areas last year and who were turned away. Boat dealers find that they have no difficulty selling the boat, if they can also supply the mooring.

The nation's waterways, from oceanside to inland rivers and lakes, have, indeed, become another "new frontier." Plenty of water, millions of people who long to be on it-all we need now are








Main Floor Plan-Pattern for Life In The Round





MOLDED PINEAPPLE-CHEESE

To Prepare: 30 MIN. To Chill: 2 TO 3 HRS.

- 1 No. 21/2 can crushed pineapple, drained (reserve sirup)
- 2 tablespoons (2 env.) unflavored gel
- 1/2 cup sugar 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup unsweetened pineapple juice
- 1 cup orange juice
- 2 or 3 drops yellow food coloring
- 1 lb. cream cheese, softened 2 teaspoons grated lemon peel
- tablespoons lemon juice
- . 1. Pour 1/2 cup of the reserved pineapple sirup into a small bowl. Sprinkle gelatin evenly over sirup. Let stand about 5 min.
- 2. Add enough water to remaining sirup to measure 1 cup liquid. Heat until very hot. Remove from heat and immediately stir in the softened gelatin until gelatin is completely dissolved. Add sugar and salt; stir until dissolved. Mix in pineapple juice, orange juice, and food coloring.
- 3. Cool; chill in refrigerator or over ice and water until mixture is slightly thicker than consistency of thick, unbeaten egg white. If chilled in refrigerator, stir occasionally; if chilled over ice and water, stir frequently.
- 4. Lightly oil a 2-qt. ring mold with salad or cooking oil (not olive oil); drain,
- 5. Beat cream cheese until fluffy. Add lemon peel and juice gradually, beating well. When gelatin mixture is about the same consistency as the cheese mixture, stir several tablespoonfuls into cheese mixture. Continue to add gelatin mixture slowly, beating constantly, until well blended. Blend in the crushed pineapple. Turn into mold and chill until firm, 2 to 3 hrs.
- 6. To unmold, run tip of knife gently around edges of mold. Invert onto a chilled serving plate and remove mold. (If necessary, wet a clean towel in hot water and wring it almost dry; wrap hot towel around mold for a few seconds. If mold does not loosen, repeat.) Arrange clusters of frosted grapes and mint leaves around the mold. Fill center of ring with cantaloupe or honey-dew melon balls and top with a spray of mint leaves. Serve with Pineapple Salad Note: This salad dressing, with or without

PINEAPPLE SALAD DRESSING

To Prepare: 35 MIN.

- 1/2 cup sugar
- a teaspoon salt
- 2 egg yolks, alightly beaten 2 egg whites

- ¾ cup chilled whipping cream
- Mix the sugar, cornstarch, and salt together in the top of a double boiler. Stir in 1/2 cup pineapple juice. Stirring gently and constantly, bring mixture rapidly to boiling over direct heat; cook for 3 min.
- 2. Place over simmering water. Vigorously stir about 3 tablespoons of the hot mixture into the egg yolks. Immediately blend into mixture in double boiler. Cook over simmering water about 5 min. Stir slowly to keep mixture cooking evenly. Remove double boiler from heat.
- 3. Beat the egg whites until frothy. Add the 2 tablespoons sugar gradually, beating well after each addition. Beat until rounded peaks are formed. Gently blend into mixture in top of double boiler.
- 4. Heat the 1 cup pineapple juice to lukewarm. Stirring constantly, gradually add to egg-white mixture. Cook over simmering water until thick and smooth, about 10 min., stirring constantly. Add the butter and stir until melted. Remove from heat. Cool; chill. 5. Meanwhile, chill a bowl and rotary





EXQUISITE CUCUMBER MOLD

To Prepare: 30 MIN. To Chill: 3 TO 4 HRS.

- 4 to 5 medium-sized cucumbers 1/2 cup cold water
- 2 tablespoons (2 env.) unflavored gelatin
- 2½ tablespoons prepared horse-radish 2 tablespoons grated onlon
- 10 to 15 drops green food coloring
- 1 teaspoon salt 1/4 teaspoon white pepper
- 1 cup chilled whipping cream
- 1. Chill a bowl and rotary beater. 2. Rinse cucumbers, cut lengthwise into halves; remove and discard seeds, and pare. Finely grind enough cucumbers in an electric blender to make 3 cups of cucumber pulp. (If cucumbers are put through a food

chopper using fine blade, pulp will be coarser and texture of mold less smooth.) Set aside. 3. Pour the cold water into a small bowl. Sprinkle the gelatin evenly over the water. Let stand about 5 min. to soften. Dissolve gelatin completely by placing bowl over very

- 4. Mix together the mayonnaise, horseradish, onion, food coloring, and a mixture of salt and white pepper. Add the dissolved gelatin gradually, stirring until thoroughly mixed. Blend in the cucumber pulp.
- 5. Chill gelatin mixture in refrigerator or over ice and water until mixture begins to gel (gets slightly thicker). If chilled in refrigerator, stir occasionally; if chilled over ice and water, stir frequently.
- 6. Lightly oil a 11/2-qt, mold with salad or cooking oil (not olive oil); set aside to drain.
- 7. When gelatin mixture begins to gel, using the chilled bowl and beater, beat whipping cream until cream is of medium consistency (piles softly). Fold whipped cream into gelatin mixture. Turn into mold. Chill until firm, 3 to 4 hrs.
- 8. Unmold (see Molded Pincapple-Cheese Salad). Set cucumber cups filled with salted pecans at equal intervals around the mold. Tuck in sprigs of water cress between the cucumber cups. (For cups, hollow out 2 in. slices of unpared cucumber to form cups. Scallop edges if desired, allowing base to remain flat.) About 8 servings


