 The catastrophe of plenty, which we are the world's only major nation to be experiencing, is turning toward us once again. This time it is a paralytic of plenty which is attacking us. In the first place, the corn crop this summer is heading toward all-time record, even 10 per cent higher than last year, which was in turn an all-time record. This increase in crop beyond anything we can possibly use is what the nation's corn farmers have produced for us under this year's system, in which acreage control had been abandoned while the government support price for corn remained. But even with acreage control still in force, they would probably have managed to increase the crop.

In the second race, the presence of so much surplus corn is encouraging the raising of hogs which will also be surplus-surplus at least in relation to our consuming power.

Richard S. Tibbitts, executive director of the TDC, has also pointed out the need for the foundation to "smooth the road" for new industry wishing to locate here.

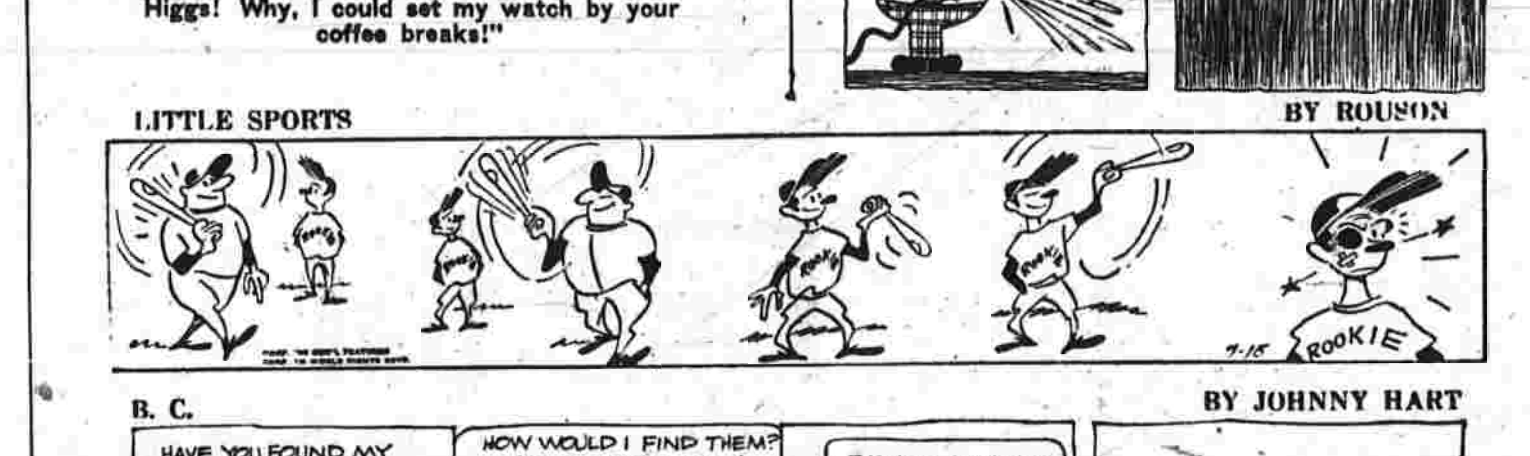
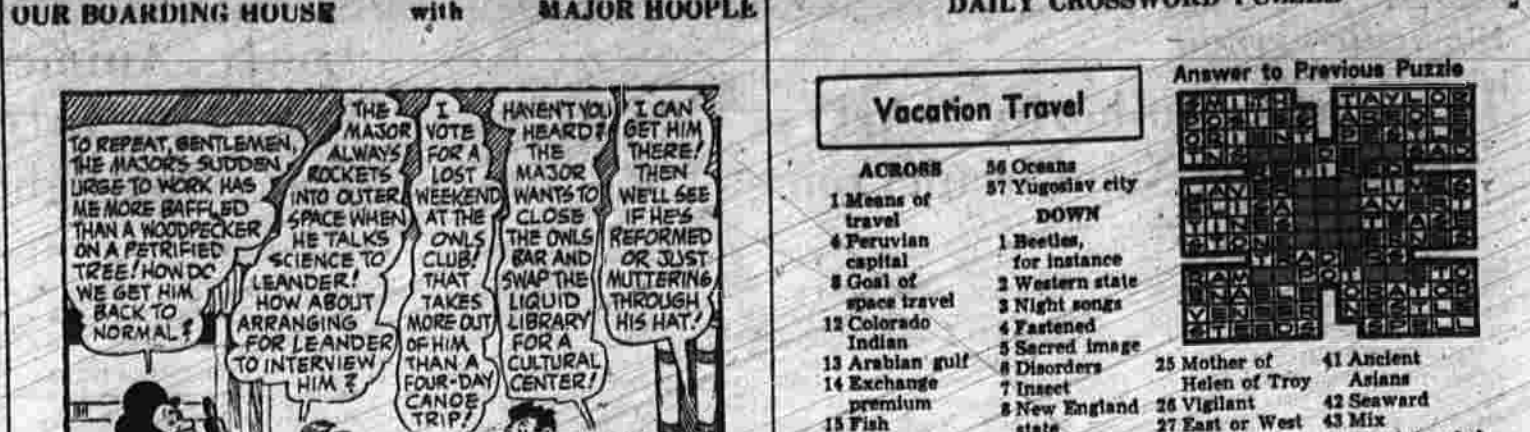
