mailed delegates. Today they chartered a small plane which showered thousands of leaflets over the gathering. "Don't let the diabolical peace movement fool you," they exhorted.

A number of Rightist groups demonstrated in automobiles and streetcars. A handful called on Soviet defectors at their noted and demanded they leave Japan at once. The Russians ignored them.

The Socialist, the left-wing General Council of Trade Unions (Soyuz) and other leftist groups used the Hiroshima anniversary to stage "united action day" protesting the security treaty.

Meanwhile, new physical examinations were given to 49 surviving seamen who were aboard the Japanese scientific survey ship "Tokujo" when it was drenched with radioactive rain after a U.S. nuclear test last year.

The examinations were ordered after the ship's chief engineer, Rikichi Nagano, 34, died Monday. The Coast Guard said the government wants to determine if any of the 50 have developed symptoms of radiation sickness but would not comment on the results of the checks.

The First National Hospital has refused to confirm or deny reports that Nagano developed leukemia after the exposure. Radiation and that this caused or contributed to his death. The immediate cause of death was given as a brain hemorrhage.

The survey ship "Tokujo," which was caught in the same rain on July 14, 1968, was ordered back from Korean waters for a re-examination of its 41 crewmen.

Nagano's death has raised the possibility of a furor similar to that which followed the atomic bombing of the fishing vessel Lucky Dragon after America's first H-bomb test at Bikini in 1954. One crew member from that ship died.

NATO After 10 Years-3 Russians Probably Hold Air, Missile Superiority

(Continued from Page One)

Honest John, a 30-mile range projectile. Outside Central Europe Italy has agreed in principle to accept intermediate range missiles but negotiations have bogged on technical points that have not been made public.

When NATO came into being the defensive air cover for Central Europe consisted of 400 aircraft, mostly piston-engine types. Gen. Jean-Etienne Valluy, commander in chief of the Allied Forces in Central Europe, estimates that he now can muster between 1,500 and 2,000 jet aircraft—fighter-bombers and interceptors. The ratio of interceptors to bombers has increased from 1 to 2. The interceptors are basically defense weapons for the destruction of enemy aircraft, while the fighter-bombers are designed to destroy enemy ground forces and installations on or near battlefields.

For long range striking power, the Allies can bring to bear the U.S. Air Force's Strategic Air Command, which has bases in England, North Africa, Turkey and Spain.

Some Allied forces, especially American, maintain a round-the-clock alert. A certain number of planes and pilots are kept in a constant state of runway readiness.

The NATO air picture was hurt by French refusal to allow almost 200 planes to be based in Germany. The French, however, less she is given, atomic know-how and control of the nuclear bomb.

On July 3, the United States announced that three fighter-bomber squadrons—200 planes in all—were transferred out of France and most would be sent to England, since the bombers based in France would have to go elsewhere to be based with A-bombing units. The United States decided they were useless in France.

The departure of the fighter-bombers leaves only the 1st Royal Canadian Air Division, 50 B-70 interceptors, as the only major NATO Air Force in France. The Canadians shortly are to receive 74 B-70 interceptors and then will be given counter-offensive missions.

Reinforcing the NATO Air Force is the fast-growing West German Air Force. At present the Germans have about 100 of the subsonic F4E Republic built and some F104 Lockheed fighters.

The West Germans have ordered 88 F104s and plan to build 200 more under contract. By 1969, the West Germans expect to have an Air Force of 1,000 first line jets.

The British, who hold that manned aircraft are essential, have contributed 250 Canberra bombers and Hawker-Hunter interceptors to the NATO air force.

The French have declined to integrate their air force into the NATO operation except for a few Mystere IVs and F4Es in Germany.

By and large, the U.S. Air Force, equipped with "Century series" aircraft—F100s through F106s—constitutes the backbone of the defensive and counter-offensive air forces in Central Europe, about 1,100 planes.

The Danes, Belgians and Dutch have small forces, flying mostly F4Es and F4Bs.

East of the Iron Curtain in the satellite nations and along the Russian border 300 airfields are reported. The Soviets are reported to have a 20,000 all-jet force, including 5,100 medium bombers and 200 long range heavy bombers. There are 25 NATO airbases in Germany, all within minutes flying time of the Russian border. The Russians have a large number of MIG-17 aircraft of the sort defeated by the F86s in Korea. They also have some up with a MIG-19 and a MIG-21 in numbers which are believed to be roughly a match for the United States' Century series planes.

In addition, they have been pushing their YAK-28 twin-jet, supersonic all weather fighters into fields farther and farther to the West.

The Russians also are said to be busy with a number of missile launching sites for their 700-mile range R-1000 missiles in the satellite nations and pads for their 1,500-mile missile, the T2 along their western borders.

Added up, this means that the Soviet probably have a missile and air superiority over the Allies as of today.

Neither side has much of an air defense capability though it is believed that the Russians are running production of an air defense missile similar to the U.S. man Nike-Ajax and Nike-Zeus which are designed to provide intense defense for a relatively small area.

Now You Can Call New York Direct

Connecticut telephone customers served by direct distance dialing (DDD) may now call directly to New York City information operators for metropolitan numbers by dialing a "universal" information number.

DDD customers here will dial "12" to signal that the call is going outside the local calling area; "212" to route the call to New York a.c. "505-1212" the new "universal" information number. As on all DDD calls, an operator will take the call for his number, but there will be no charge for the call.

Use of the number "505-1212" in New York is the first step toward the eventual adoption of a uniform long-distance information code throughout the United States and Canada.

The code enables users to place a direct, toll-free call to a New York City information operator without going through the long-distance operator.

At present, callers must dial the operator who then reaches the

Year-End Report Filed by Police

Close adherence to conditions set by the 1968-69 budget marked the operation of the Manchester Police Department for the year ending July 31 according to a report submitted to the town by Police Chief James M. Pearson.

An appropriation of \$300,000, the department spent \$202,817.11 for administrative and general investigation work and for operation and maintenance of equipment.

The department also spent \$100,000 for police academy and school tr. a budget, spending \$100,000 out of \$120,000 for the former and \$20,000 out of \$20,000 for the latter.

During the course of the year, police made 1,878 arrests, 1,211 for motor vehicle violations and the remaining 667 for other misdemeanors.

Parking and rules of the road violations headed the motor vehicle list with 215 of each. The most numerous arrests in the misdemeanor column were for intoxication (226) and breach of the peace (128). Police also reported 31 arrests for assault and battery, 30 for theft and 26 for breaking and entering.

Chief Pearson also noted the department ended the year at a shortage of 42 officers and patrolmen. He pointed out that the live and active police force, including courses at the Hartford Police Academy and that all members received refresher and advanced courses in first aid.

In addition, Pearson noted the successful turnout for the third auto safety inspection here, the cost of which was covered by the Auxiliary Police, and favorable comments from the Connecticut State Police concerning appearance of two new 2-toned police cruisers.

2 Quakes Jolt Western Area

Seattle, Aug. 6 (AP)—Two earthquakes shook the little town of Chehalis and were felt over wide areas of Washington state last night.

No major damage or injuries were reported.

The first tremor came at 7:56 p.m.; the second at 8:40.

The earthquakes were felt in an area bordering the Cascade mountains from Olympia north to the Canadian border.

At Chehalis, the merchandise in a grocery store was knocked off shelves by the first quake. Books tumbled from some shelves in the Chehalis Town Library, and a chimney in the town was knocked down.

In the mountain area north and west of Wenatchee, the tremors sent rocks crashing down roadways, but the state patrol said all roads were open to traffic.
