Gas Tank Blast, Fire Kills 2, Injures 100

KANSAS CITY, Aug. 19 (AP)—A burning gasoline tank exploded and hurled forward like a giant flame-thrower, engulfing a blast of fire. That's how yesterday's gasoline tank station exploded took its toll.

Two flames died. They were Virgil L. Bama, 28, and Neal K. Owen, 28. Several others, four of them in critical condition, remained in hospitals today.

More than 200 persons suffered burns, other injuries and exhaustion. The loss was estimated at \$100,000.

A Continental Oil Co. bulk station of four big horizontal tanks located behind a filling station at the state line between the two Kansas cities, was the scene. The blast erupted while two men were filling tanks. The cause was not known.

Firemen fought a cordon along Southwest Boulevard, pouring streams of water on the burning tanks and cooling two 11,000-gallon tanks nearby.

First one, the smaller of the bigger tanks exploded toward the Pitzer Railroad yards, away from the street.

Then a third took off like an uncontrolled rocket, striking a 40-foot-wide path south across the boulevard and north across the railroad yards.

Firemen in its path didn't have a chance. As they turned to run they bolted around them.

House for Ending Equal Time Rule

WASHINGTON, Aug. 19 (AP)—The House has passed a bill to end equal time requirements for radio and television stations in news broadcasts about political candidates.

Under existing law, broadcast stations who display a political candidate in the course of a news broadcast must give equal free time to any other bona fide candidate for that office, no matter how tiny his party or how odd his platform.

The House bill, passed by a one-sided vote yesterday, would exempt from the equal time requirement any appearance of a candidate on a bona fide newscast or on-the-spot coverage of a news event. If the candidate's appearance was incidental to presenting the news.

The House bill has one major difference from a similar bill passed previously by the Senate. Opponents of the House bill said it was intended to include panel shows, such as NBC's "Meet the Press" or CBS' "Face the Nation," in the category of programs on which equal time is not required.

The Senate bill, however, specifically excluded panel shows from the exemption.

The Senate can now either accept the House version or call for a conference committee to work out this and other differences.

Buena Aires (P. Sylvia Ker- senbaum, an attractive 17-year-old who likes swimming, dancing and singing, is one of South America's brightest piano prospects. 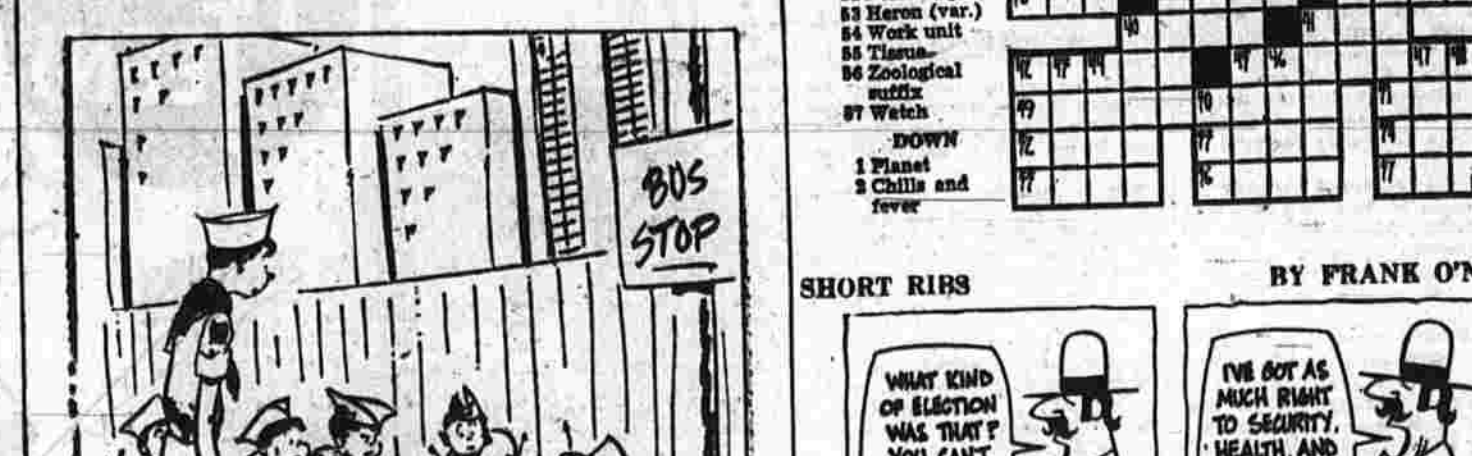
