The Day the War Started—3 Destruction of Poland First Goal for Hitler

(Continued from Page One)

When I heard planes I pushed the window open and looked out. More than 50 big German bombers were flying over the Vistula River. The terrible confusion caused by the alarms and attacks and the ever-growing number of people who were leaving Warsaw for safer country areas made it extremely difficult to move about the barricaded streets, check on bomb damage, or get to see and talk to anyone who knew anything.

Spending each other's papers and I was able to get firsthand information at the main railway station where bombs damaged hospital cars under canopies and wounded a score of soldiers at the East Railway Station where a bomb hit a troop car and killed 10 and wounded 20 in an apartment house and a row of small homes where 20 died in the rubble.

Then from somewhere haphazard bombing the Germans began to tighten up their landing pattern and the Hunks bombed stopped close and closer.

After one hour of bombed areas I went back to our second-floor office and began typing a story

story as the Nazi bombers repeated their deadly antics. When the Poles learned late on Sunday that Great Britain and France had declared war on Germany they went wild with joy, assuming that it meant a quick, sure victory. By the hundreds they danced and yelled and sang down the street to the French embassy until long past midnight.

Almost as their cheers died away the Germans launched six spearhead attacks along Poland's borders, pushing toward Warsaw. The Poles did not know, nor dream, that Poland would be prostrate long before any help came and never would be the same again.

Seasonal Slipcovers Amuse Australian

By JUDITH ARBAHAN
You know what astonished an Australian visiting in this country? The number of cars? No. American ignorance about Australia? Well, sort of. The social life of our teenagers? Guess again.

It's the fact that we change slipcovers and drapes in the spring and fall.

Sandra Todd, a blue-eyed, blond, 21-year-old secretary from Melbourne giggled over the way we change the drapes on our windows and furniture. Sandy arrived in Manchester a week ago to visit Gail Bagelson, 437 S. Main St. Sandy is touring the country under the auspices of the Episcopal Church, the same organization which sponsored Gail's tour of Australia recently.

The object of the tour is to permit the girls to see how the members in 32 different countries cope with the same problem, all within the same religious framework.

Sandy has found many things different in this country from the customs in her own country. For one thing, the cost of meals here is very high, she said. In Australia a good meal for 12 costs \$10.

She found that many Americans lack all knowledge of life in Australia. She was asked to sign her autograph and a message "In Australia, Americans tend to think of her country as an expense of bush with a population composed mostly of kangaroos, and there isn't a kangaroo in the bunch."

Another misconception Americans have about her country concerns the weather, which is similar to ours but in reverse, so they have summer when we have winter. She was once asked if Australians celebrate Christmas in July so they can have snow.

Sandy admitted, however, that many Australians have a confused idea of life here. "This is due to the gangster and western movies shown on television in that question to Gail in Chicago was, 'Could you show me a Jap? I've heard they're here.' They looked, but didn't see any. At least not with a Thompson sub-machine gun."

She arrived in this country in June, and has spent the past three months touring. Her visit to Gail was a chance to relax from the strain of travel although Gail had bragged so about Manchester as the best town in the country that Sandy had to see some of it for herself.

A major difference between young people in this country and Australia, besides the early dating in this country, is the pattern of education to age 14 instead of 16. Teaching is more intensive so that a senior in an Australian high school is doing about the same work as a freshman in college here. Far fewer students go to college in Australia, compared to this country, she said.

Only about 10 per cent of Australian students go to college. On the other hand, said Gail, there isn't the pressure to go to college in Australia that there is in this country. 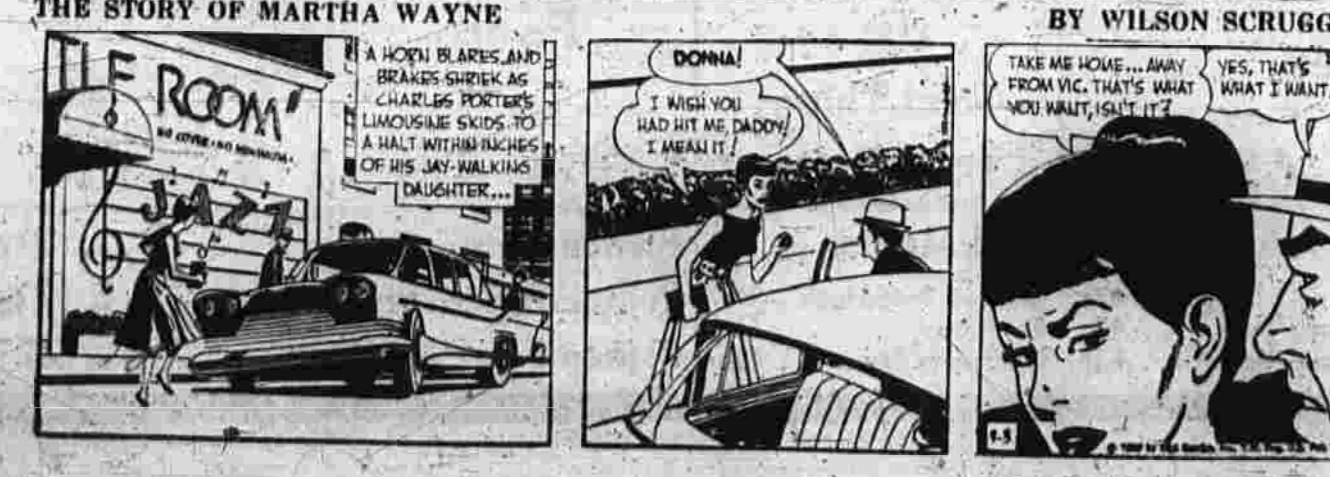

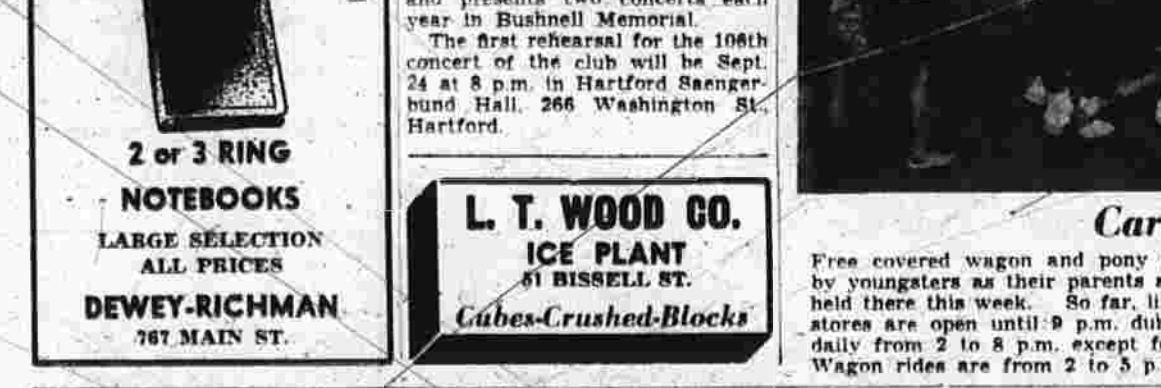
